Section 7.11(4) is amended to read as follows: (4) As soon as possible after appointments to standing committees have been made, each committee shall elect a chairperson, and vice-chairperson and a secretary and promptly report the results of the election to the board. These officers shall serve two-year terms or until their successors are elected. Officers may be removed from office at the pleasure of the membership as provided in this subchapter.

All standing committees shall concern themselves with the formulation of county policy to be carried out by the departments for which they have oversight, and shall consult with the departments in formulating policy. Standing committees shall continually monitor the performance of departments and agencies in carrying out the policies of Dane County, and shall review and make recommendations on the annual budgets of these departments, offices and agencies as provided for in s. 7.24.

Standing committees shall have referred to them and act on all resolutions and ordinances affecting policy for any department, office or agency for which they have responsibility. Committees do not vote on budget resolutions. The Personnel and 127 Finance Committee considers committee recommendations, as well as proposed amendments from individual supervisors, and makes a recommendation on the 128 129 operating and capital appropriations resolutions to the board. 130 At least one full two committee meetings shall be scheduled to consider (2) 131 such proposed budgets, with the public invited to attend. 132 Budget amendments that have been drafted and provided to committee (3) 133 staff prior to the posting of the committee agenda will be included in a packet of 134 amendments as an attachment associated with to the operating or capital budget 135 resolution. The committee may, pursuant to a suspension of rules, consider 136 budget amendments drafted after the agenda has posted. The sponsor of the 137 amendment that has not been included in the amendment packet attached to the 138 posted agenda shall bring copies of the amendment to the committee meeting for

distribution to committee members to be presented for information, but no 139 140 committee action will be taken and the public prior to any action on the 141 amendment. 142 (4) Amendments drafted after the standing committee agenda is posted may, upon request of the sponsor, be added to the Personnel and Finance Committee 143 144 agenda when the associated standing committee amendments are considered, 145 but must be posted as part of that agenda at least 24 hours prior to the meeting. 146 A budget amendment considered by a committee may be amended by the (5) 147 committee. 148 (6) Amendments not included in the Personnel and Finance Committee's recommendations on the budget resolutions may be offered as a floor 149 150 amendment at the County Board's budget meeting, but must be posted as part of 151 the board agenda at least 24 hours prior to the meeting. 152 (47) Each committee shall have an obligation to monitor the current year's 153 budget of each department, agency or office for which it has responsibilities to 154 assure compliance with budgetary limitations. 155 156 ARTICLE 16. Section 7.62(9) is created to read as follows: 157 Board members are expected to attend meetings in person, but may (9) 158 participate in a meeting via telephone or other electronic media if such 159 participation is specifically noted on the agenda at least 24 hours prior to the 160 meeting. 161 162 ARTICLE 17. Section 7.63(6) is amended to read as follows: 163 No registrant shall speak for more than five minutes, subject to the (6) 164 following exceptions: 165 (a) No registrant using an interpreter shall speak for more than ten (10) 166 minutes: and 167 except that oon matters being reconsidered by the board, and (b) 168 consideration of motions to override county executive vetoes, no registrant shall speak for more than two minutes, and no registrant using an interpreter shall 169 170 speak for more than four (4) minutes. 171 172 173
