Survey of COVID Impact on Dane County Healthcare Workers

Conducted January 6 – January 10, 2022

Methodology


In partnership with Victoria Research, Elevated Public Affairs conducted a survey of **Dane County healthcare workers** for SEIU Wisconsin.

- ❖ Survey conducted from January 6-January 10, 2022.
- ❖ This analysis presents the results of 920 Dane County healthcare worker interviews, including RNs, CNAs and others from hospitals, nursing homes, and other settings, with the majority being from hospitals.
- Our original sample goals was 400, but our outreach doubled our expectations – perhaps a cry for help.
- ❖ Margin of Error: ± 3.2%






Pandemic has negatively impacted workers' well-being, exacerbating prepandemic staffing shortages & issues




- 1 in 6 Dane County health care workers gives a 10 out of 10, the worst rating, about the very severe impact of the pandemic on their physical and mental wellbeing.
- Over half (51%) of health care workers give an 8, 9, or 10 rating on the 1 to 10 scale.
- The average rating was 7.4.
- Only 24% report paid sick leave for COVID.

Stress, anxiety, coping mechanisms, and consideration of suicide widespread due to the pandemic



Significant concerns about how understaffing is impacting patient care




90% of Dane County healthcare workers agree that understaffing is having a "major negative impact on patients."

79% of women healthcare workers under age 40 are **dissatisfied about staffing levels** – and 47% are *very* dissatisfied.

Employer response to the pandemic has not been enough...

...and employers alone cannot solve this problem.

62% are dissatisfied with the pandemic-related support provided by their employer.




The pandemic feels like a warzone to healthcare workers in Dane County

Political division, false info has increased stress


Hard to get up and go in as stress, conditions never seem to get better




45% say they've faced threats or intimidation from patients or patients' families

Most healthcare workers have considered leaving because of the pandemic

82% have considered leaving the healthcare workforce and/or know a co-worker who has considered leaving due to the pandemic.



97% of Dane County healthcare workers support utilizing ARPA funding to act
