

The Dream Bus: 2021 Update



Thank you for your generous support for the Dream Bus in 2021. A partnership between the Dane County Library Service and Madison Public Library, this mobile unit serves to extend library service beyond our physical locations and offer accessible literacy programs to the residents of under-resourced neighborhoods in the Madison community.

With the onset of the Covid pandemic, the bus has been particularly valuable to the patrons it serves, providing access to books, free Wi-Fi, literacy activities, and makers projects for kids of all ages. This year, contributions helped expand the bus's

media collection, allowed for document translation into Spanish and English, supported the development of marketing materials, and more.

Weekly Route

While 2020 put a pause on much in-person activity, 2021 allowed for a return to many pre-Covid services and events. With that increase in mobility, the Dream Bus staff were happy to be able to resume pre-pandemic levels of service to their target benefitting communities, traveling to a variety of neighborhoods in Madisons each week.

During these stops, Dream Bus patrons signed up for library cards, browsed, checked out, and returned materials, placed and picked up holds, and used the available WiFi.

In 2021, the Dream Bus's schedule focused on schools and locations that offer after-school or out-of-school activities for kids, helping to build youth literacy skills and extend the library's reach. Over the course of the winter months, the Dream Bus weekly schedule has been tailored to visit 12 neighborhoods that serve not only Madison students, but also children from adjacent communities in Sun Prairie, Fitchburg, and Middleton-Cross Plains:

Community Partnerships



In addition to its regularly scheduled operations, the Dream Bus attends community functions to build awareness of library services and also offers event attendees the opportunity to sign up for library cards and check out books. Similar to resuming its prepandemic weekly routing, the bus also on hand more in-person events this year.

One of the bus's new partnerships in 2021 was with Madison's professional soccer team Forward Madison FC. Through this partnership, the Dream Bus was present at five soccer games over the course of the summer and fall.

Dream Bus & The Pandemic

Shortly upon resuming its regular school stops this fall, Director of Dane County Library Services, Tracy Herold, was on hand to assist children at Mendota Elementary School during MSCR (Madison School and Community Recreation) afterschool programming. A group of kindergarten students were brought out to the bus, and Herold explained that the Dream Bus was a library on wheels. When she pressed further, Herold realized that these five-year-old students were unfamiliar with the concept of a library as they were too young to remember visiting the library prior to the pandemic.

Through this interaction, Herold was reminded of the important role this institution plays in children's lives. Among the many impacts Covid has had on kids, she noted how children have been missing the library and having the agency to pick their own books to read. Bringing the Dream Bus out in the community helps ensure children have access to media and literacy opportunities that are so important to their growth and development.

Since the onset of the Covid pandemic, it has become clear that services such as the Dream Bus play a vital role in our community.
