ACCEPTING ADDITIONAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE BLOCK GRANT SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDS
DCDHS – BEHAVIORAL HEALTH DIVISION

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services has distributed supplemental Substance Abuse Block Grant funds to counties as part of a two-year award. These supplemental funds originate with the federal government and are part of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Supplemental Awards and are to be utilized to supplement current substance use disorder prevention, treatment and recovery services, and address unmet needs or gaps in services in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Some of these funds have already been budgeted. This resolution distributes funds that were not previously allocated to the DCDHS budget. The funds in this portion of the award will be used to fund case management and psychiatry for individuals with a chronic history of substance use disorder, which has resulted in significant impairments in functioning and a significant use of publicly-funded services. These services will be provided by Tellurian. These funds will also be used to add support to the Resource Bridge program operated by Journey Mental Health Center. Resource Bridge focuses on assisting individuals who are not connected with any behavioral health services and have a high need for these services immediately following a period of incarceration or a stay in a psychiatric hospital, or other facility that treats highly acute needs. Individuals served by both programs are typically at high risk of returning to an institutional setting.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following revenue account be added and that the revenue and expenditure accounts be adjusted in the 2023 Behavioral Health section in the Department of Human Services:
