In 2015, Dane County created an Affordable Housing Development Fund to address its significant affordable housing gap, but did not add any staff capacity for fund administration. The housing development specialist would be responsible for managing administration of Dane County's Affordable Housing Development Fund, aligning other funding sources, collaborating with funding partners and private developers to support complex affordable housing financing packages necessary to move affordable housing initiatives forward. Current housing programs and activities are scattered throughout county government departments and quasi-government agencies like the Dane County Housing Authority. Dane County Human Services EAWS division funds homeless services programs and other stabilizing community based services, eviction prevention, some rapid rehousing programs and other housing programs are funded in other DHS divisions. The HUD Community Development Block Grant and HOME Programs, which also fund affordable housing initiatives, is administered by the Office of Economic and Workforce Development, in the County Executive's Office. Dane County Department of Planning and Development has worked on the Housing Needs Assessment, the Dane County Housing Summit, and Comprehensive Plan revisions related to housing. A Housing Development Specialist is necessary to oversee the administration of the annual affordable housing development fund budget allocation and coordinate our housing efforts across all departments.
