Earth Comprehensive Plan

The Town of Black Earth has adopted a Comprehensive Plan and has requested its adoption by Dane County as part of the Dane County Comprehensive Plan. In order to comply with the requirements of the state comprehensive planning law, Dane County must notify all local government jurisdictions within or adjacent to the county, giving them at least a 30 day review period prior to the county public hearing.
