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## SUB 3 to 2016 RES-572 AMENDING THE 2017 OPERATING BUDGET TO ENHANCE CITIZENSHIP ASSISTANCE SERVICES

Thousands of immigrants in Dane County are eligible for citizenship but lack the resources to
navigate the process. Dane County has proposed a program to help direct and
connect them to resources in the community that will enable them to succeed and give them a
fair shot at realizing the American Dream.

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10 Since the election of President Trump, community organizations have received a significant

11 increase in requests for legal assistance to pursue citizenship and have reached out to the

county for assistance. This resolution establishes an immigration assistance fund to be
 administered by the Madison Community Foundation. It is hoped that the initial funding in the

14 amount of \$150,000 from the County will be matched by additional funds from the community.

15 Funding is transferred from the General Fund, realizing that the end of year 2016 fund balance

16 for the Department of Human Services was significantly more than anticipated during 2017

- 17 budget deliberations.
- 18

19 In support of enacting a community-driven initiative, the county has reached out to legal

20 services providers to immigrants and this resolution incorporates their ideas for an effective

21 approach to emergency immigration assistance. A collaborative group of legal services

22 providers will work with the Madison Community Foundation in development of the

35 While immediate action is essential as a result of federal actions, Dane County must develop a

36 long-term approach to support the immigrant community. Working together, the Department of

37 Administration, the Department of Human Services, and the Tamara D. Grigsby Office for Equity

and Inclusion should complete research on best practices for the county's role in supporting
 immigrants in our community and report to the County Executive, the Health and Human Needs

40 Committee, the Executive Committee, and the Personnel and Finance Committee by July 15,

- 41 2017 with proposals that can be considered as part of the 2018 budget.

NOW THEREFORE BE It RESOLVED that \$150,000 be transferred from the General Fund to
 the Department of Human Services.

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46 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following line item be added to the 2017 operating 47 budget: HSADMIN-NEW "Immigration Assistance Fund" \$150,000

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- 49 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Immigration Assistance Fund be allocated to the
- 50 Madison Community Foundation, which will work with a collaborative partnership of legal
- 51 services providers to immigrants to fundraise and to disburse the funds.

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53 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the legal services providers identified above must submit to Dane County an agreement among themselves establishing a collaborative partnership and 54 55 advisory board for use and governance of the fund, including a plan for governance of disbursements from the fund to the legal services providers. The plan should include 56 57 disbursements from the fund for direct services or education related to the following areas: 58 Asylum Applications, Adjustment of Status for Refugees and Asylees, Violence Against Women 59 Act self-petitions, U Visas, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) applications, 60 Naturalization applications, T Visas, Immigrant Visa Petitions, Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS) applications, Withholding of Removal or Convention Against Torture, Undocumented 61 62 Cancellation of Removal, Permanent Resident Cancellation of Removal, and other deportation 63 defense. Quarterly reports will be made to the County Executive, the Director of the Tamara D. 64 Grigsby Office for Equity and Inclusion, the Director of Human Services, and the County Board. 65 BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED that, should Dane County be selected to be part of the Vera 66 67 Institute of Justice National Network of Local Leaders Keeping Families Together and Communities Strong and Safe, then the Vera Institute will provide technical assistance and work 68 69 with the advisory board to distribute the funds in an impartial and equitable manner, taking into 70 consideration highest needs in the community, and will also assist in development of a 71 management approach; if not selected as part of the Vera Institute initiative, Dane County 72 Department of Human Services will work with the advisory board to determine an equitable plan 73 for fund disbursement including an application process with a neutral party making funding 74 decisions. 75 76 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, upon receipt of a plan as specified above and approval by the Health and Human Needs Committee and the Personnel and Finance Committee, the 77 78 county will transfer governance of the fund to the provider collaborative partnership.

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80 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a new 1.0 FTE

81 "Immigration Ombudsman" bilingual case manager position be created in the Joining Forces for

Families program of the Human Services Department with a June 1, 2017 start date to serve as

83 a direct service provider to the immigrant community in Dane County, and the following

transfers be made within the Human Services Department operating budget to reflect salary
 savings realized in 2017 from vacant positions and to reflect the cost of the new position.

90 Department of Human Services and the Tamara D. Grigsby Office for Equity and Inclusion

91 should complete research on best practices for the county's role in supporting immigrants in our

92 community and report to the County Executive, the Health and Human Needs Committee, the

93 Executive Committee and the Personnel and Finance Committee by July 15, 2017 with

94 proposals that can be considered as part of the 2018 budget. These recommendations shall

95 include proposals for partnering with the City of Madison on Immigration Assistance.

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## 97 Explanation of the Substitute Amendment:

98 Due to the immediate and growing need for immigration services in Dane County and the

99 shortage of funds for front-line immigration services, this substitute amendment creates a 1.0

100 FTE Joining forces for Families position beginning June 1, 2017 as well as an Immigration

101 Assistance Fund at the Madison Community Foundation is seeded with \$150,000.

102 In addition, the Sub to Res 572 also:

- Transfers funds from the General Fund for the Immigration Assistance Fund, in
   recognition of the Department of Human Services' return of funds in excess of \$150,000
   to the General Fund at the end of 2016,
- Defines services for which the funds may be used based on input from front-line
   immigration service providers.
- Recognizes the potential involvement of the Vera Institute of Justice, a nationally
   recognized research and technical support organization dedicated to fairness, safety,
   and strong communities
- Establishes a process for transferring responsibilities of fund governance from the
   County to a collaboration of immigration service providers.
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
