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2017 RES-240 ACCEPTING STATE OF WISCONSIN GRANT FUNDS AND AMENDING 2017 PROFESSIONAL SERVICE CONTRACTS WITH JOURNEY MENTAL **HEALTH CENTER AND TELLURIAN** DCDHS - ACS & CYF DIVISIONS

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The Department of Health Services has awarded State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis (STR) grant funds to Dane County to address unmet needs of the opioid dependent population. The grant will allow services to be enhanced in three distinct ways in Dane County: 1) Medication Assisted Therapy will be added to existing outpatient treatment for intravenous drug users at Journey Mental Health Center. The grant will fund injectable naltrexone (Vivitrol) and Suboxone, medications that will combat the cravings experienced by opiate-dependent individuals entering recovery. These medications are not currently available to most individuals who do not have insurance. This grant funds medication for these individuals. 2) Vivitrol will be included as an option for opioid dependent individuals who are discharging from the Treatment Readiness Center and entering residential treatment. Typically, an individual will stay in the Treatment Readiness Center (in the Detoxification Facility operated by Tellurian) for seven days in order to complete their withdrawal from opioids prior to being discharged and beginning county-funded residential treatment. This grant makes medication (Vivitrol) available to manage the ongoing cravings for those who are discharged to begin county-funded residential treatment. 3) The existing Jail-Opiate Recovery Project will be expanded to include opiate dependent individuals who are in the Dane County Jail for between seven and 30 days. The current project, which is funded by the Wisconsin Department of Justice, provides medication assisted treatment to those who have been in the Dane County Jail for at least 30 days. These grant funds enable Journey Mental Health Center to add counselor time in the Dane County Jail to expand this project.

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The grant funds total \$363,410 for the period of July 1, 2017 – April 30, 2018. With these funds, Dane County Department of Human Services seeks to amend the existing professional services contracts with Journey Mental Health Center and Tellurian to provide these services. The grant is designed to meet unmet or waiting list needs for counties. These existing programs serving opioid dependent individuals have the availability to quickly add medication assisted therapy for the populations currently being served.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following revenue accounts be created and credited to the General Fund and transferred from the general fund to the following expenditure accounts in the Department of Human Services:
