1. Amended and Restated "Franklin" Easement, Groundswell and Town of Dunn

Groundswell Conservancy, the Town of Dunn and Dane County partnered on the original conservation easement in 2002. The easement was amended in 2015. Tony Abate of Groundswell Conservancy gave an overview of proposed easement changes: removing ties to zoning districts, accurately reflecting on the ground improvements and further restricting impervious surfaces. The property is owned by Vitruvian Farms, an organic vegetable farm supplying residents and restaurants with locally grown food.

Groundswell Conservancy monitors the easement.
