Background

Roadmap to Reducing Violence Released

The <u>Roadmap to Reducing Violence</u>, a comprehensive, 5-year plan to reduce violence in Madison & Dane County was released in March 2021. Violence Prevention Coalition reconvened.

Violence Prevention Unit (VPU) Formalized

Violence prevention unit expanded from a Violence Prevention Outreach & Response Coordinator and Data Analyst to include a Violence Prevention Supervisor, Violence Prevention Coordinator, Public Health Specialist – CARES Program, and Crime Reduction Community Development Specialist.

Roadmap to Reducing Violence

The Roadmap is a multi-year plan that includes five goals for reducing violence in our communities:

Goal 1: Understand violence in our community through data.

Goal 2: Support community engagement with children, youth and families.

Goal 3: Foster strong neighborhoods.

Goal 4: Bolster and increase intervention and continuous healing for those affected by violence.

Goal 5: Strengthen community capacity, engagement, and coordination of violence prevention efforts.

MDCVP Coalition

Madison Dane County Violence Prevention Coalition (MDCVP) Reconvened

June 2021: Identified strategic priorities for each of the 5 goals of the Roadmap for 2022. Formed coalition workgroups to support the development and implementation of action plans to address the strategic priorities.

October 2021: Shared the 2022 priorities of all MDCVP coalition workgroups and preliminary coalition data surveillance & evaluation plans.

July – December 2021: Planned and hosted workgroup meetings. Started 2022 workgroup action plans.

MDCVP Coalition

2022 Planning + Implementation

- Work Groups: Each of the 5 work groups developing action plans and activities to support the goals of the Roadmap.
- Service Provision Survey + Assessment
- Data Surveillance & Monitoring Inform Decision Making
- . **ARPA Funding:** Issue RFP and fund programming based on prioritized activities of work groups

Funding and Timeline:

Overview – the American Recovery Program Act (ARPA):

- ARPA/SLFRF--No sole source
 - \$1.5 million from City/County combined for Violence Prevention
 - Funding is to support PHMDC violence prevention infrastructure and to support the work of the Coalition.
 - The goal is to maximize the amount of funding available through RFP
 - Spending through June 2024
- Competitive RFP(s) issued by PHMDC to address priorities of Work Groups
 - Plan to issue RFP(s) in May 2022
- A funding FAQ document is under development and will be shared with the workgroups in an upcoming meeting



Understand Violence in Our Community Through Data

VPU Goal: Leverage partnerships throughout Dane County to receive and report on data on a regular basis.

Strategy 1: Use timely, comprehensive data to prioritize and implement prevention efforts

Strategy 2: Create data dissemination tools to aid in the understanding of violence data

Strategy 3: Enhance and strengthen data about gun ownership, safety, and use

Violence Prevention Unit Activities:

Community Safety Intervention Team (CSIT)

- Sharing information on violent incidents; tracking of cases and outcomes
- CSIT quarterly reports

Data Collection & Analysis

- Data inventory of violent crime information in Dane County, which will allow the VPU to analyze and report on relevant crime trends.
- Make recommendations and support violence prevention and intervention efforts

Community Alternative Response Emergency Services (CARES)

- · September: Launched CARES program; started responding to non-violent, mental health crises.
- Strategic planning, program evaluation, data dashboard

Byrne Criminal Justice Grant – Downtown Madison Safety Initiative

- Implementing violence interventions based on data
- Focus on sexual violence and gun crimes
