ACCEPTANCE OF NATIONAL FISH AND WILDLIFE FOUNDATION GRANT SUB-AWARD  
FROM ICE AGE TRAIL ALLIANCE

Dane County Parks has secured \$124,250 in funding from the Ice Age Trail Alliance as a grant sub-award of a National Fish and Wildlife Foundation grant to supports enhanced collaboration with partner organizations to multiply efforts in pollinator habitat restoration work.

Dane County Parks staff and volunteers work on hundreds of acres of county parkland annually to restore natural communities and improve pollinator habitat for the monarch butterfly, karner blue butterfly, rusty patched bumble bee, regal fritillary, and other pollinators. The federally endangered rusty patch bumble bee is known to be found in several Dane County Parks.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board of Supervisors and the Dane County Executive hereby accept \$124,250 in funds from the Ice Age Trail Alliance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive and the County Clerk be authorized to sign the grant agreement letter; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Parks Director and Parks Botanist/Naturalists are authorized to submit reimbursement claims along with necessary supporting documentation upon project completion, and take necessary action to undertake, direct, and complete approved projects; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that revenue account LWRPKOP "NEW" "IATA NFWF Pollinator Grant" be created by \$124,250 and LWRPKOP 10079 "LTE-Land Management/Restoration" increase by \$99,100, LWRPKOP 10108 "Social Security" increase by \$8,209 and LWRPKOP 21377 "Land Management Supplies" increase by \$16,941. All Funds shall be carried forward until realized and expended.
