Brian Arndt, Development Director Madison Area Food Pantry Gardens (MAFPG) Board of Directors gave a overview of the MAFPG and their desire to purchase the Pope Farm Homestead for a permanent farm center. Their request from the Dane County Conservation Fund Grant Program is to purchase the 15-acre Pope Farm Homestead where they have operated on a lease-to-prove model for the past two growing seasons. This expanded footprint has allowed their organization to build capacity and make an even greater impact on the health and well-being of the community by helping to create more community-level nutrition security by increasing supply of first choice, fresh, culturally relevant produce.
