Intent/Justification

The PASER scale is a 1-10 rating system for road pavement condition developed by the University of Wisconsin-Madison Transportation Information Center. PASER uses visual inspection to evaluate pavement surface conditions. When assessed correctly, PASER ratings provide a basis for comparing the quality of roadway segments.

The paser rating on CTH G was lowered from 6 to 5 during the 2021 spring road tour. During 2021, the Highway and Transportation Department wedged a small section of the road using Highway Operating Maintenance funds. This provision directs the Highway and Transportation Department to allocate funds from the same source to preserve equally deteriorated sections until the projected 2025 resurfacing.
