Intent/Justification

This amendment adds \$300,000 to the Capital Budget of the Land & Water Resources Department to support a county matching grant program to help local units of government purchase agricultural conservation easements on working farm lands in rural Dane County as part of a farmland preservation strategy. The program should meet criteria described in the 2022 Farmland Preservation Plan and should pay for 25% of the cost of acquisition of agricultural conservation easements. This program will help the local communities access additional

matching funds available from the Natural Resources Conservation Service and other entities. Establising a ACEP program was a key recommendation contained in the draft Farmland Preservation Plan. The Operating Budget Resolution establishes a workgroup to define the operational parameters of the program.
