7	an Emergency Proclamation, based on the increasing transmission of COVID-19 within the City
8	of Madison; On March 16, 2020, pursuant to Wis. Stat. 323.11, the County Executive imposed a
9	Declaration of Local State of Emergency for 60 days, subject to extension authorized by the
10	County Board, and on March 19th the County Board approved this declaration; and
11	
12	On March 24, 2020, the Governor of Wisconsin issued Emergency Order #12 ordering
13	individuals to remain home except for Essential Travel; and
14	
15	As part of the Governor's Order all Nonessential Businesses are required to close; and
16	The electric of numerous businesses throughout the City Dana County has the notential to have
17	The closure of numerous businesses throughout the City Dane County has the potential to have
18 19	significant financial impact on residents.
20	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that effective April 1, 2020 until December 31, 2020,
21	Public Health Madison and Dane County is authorized to reduce the fees associated with food
22	and drink establishments, temporary food establishments, tattoo and body piercing, hotels and
23	tourist rooming houses, campgrounds and recreational campgrounds to the 2019 rate and
24	waive late fees and offer renewal fee deferment if not contrary to Wisconsin Department of
25	Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection guidelines.
