Planning Process for a Community Justice Center

- Community members and leaders reiterated a lack of trust in the criminal justice system due to racial bias
- Long-time community members feel let down by broken promises for change made in the past and fear that this planning process may end the same way
- Inclusive planning must include community-based organizations and individuals with lived experience
- Expedite actions steps within a *core planning team* and *community advisory board*.

Planning Process for a Community Justice Center

Core planning team

- Consisting of multiple agencies that will contribute to services and the legal functions of the community justice center initiative.
- Team members should include:
 - Representatives from each service provider offering services at the center
 - a resource coordinator to streamline service scheduling
 - and a community justice center initiative director to oversee the collaboration of social services and the legal processes.
 - If a community court is included in the center, a representative from the offices of the District Attorney, Public Defender, Clerk of Courts, and judiciary (Municipal Court and Circuit Court) to finalize case and service flow.

Community Advisory Board

- Steering committee to provide feedback and ideas to the core planning team.
- To include individuals with lived experience who reflect the individuals the community justice center initiative aims to serve.
