2023 Budget Overview **Fiscal**

Total: \$250,125,672

\$160,594,541 outside revenue

\$89,531,131 county levy

This proposed budget meets the expectation of not increasing our reliance on local levy dollars, as directed.



2023 Budget Overview Programmatic Highlights

- Create a Youth Transitional Living Program
- Develop a youth crisis stabilization model to support children with acute mental health needs
- Increase support of Children's Long-term Support to support the growing caseloads and eliminate the enrollment waitlist
- Add support for **Child Protective Services** to meet the growing need for youth services from behavioral health to children involved in CPS
- Increase payment rate **to foster care** providers
- Add staff for **Kin and Foster** care under the Families First Prevention & Service Act



2023 Budget Overview Programmatic Highlights

- Increase AAA Focal Point funding to cover higher food costs, increase capacity for case management, and support cultural diversity programming.
- Increase Journey Mental Health CARES Program funding
- Invest in **an outpatient behavioral health clinical program** collaborative in partnership with Journey Mental Health and Centro Hispano.
- Add older adult support, including dietetics and dementia care
- Increase support Comprehensive Community Services



2023 Budget Overview Programmatic Highlights

- Add an Accountant and IT Business Analyst Positions, and IT funding to keep pace with the increased contracting requirements and DCDHS footprint expansion
- Increase funding for medical supplies at Badger Prairie Health Care Center,
- Invest in **electric vehicle** purchases (4 vehicles) to modernize the DCDHS fleet




Final Thoughts

- Over 700 expert staff participate every day in serving our community.

- Providing support for community members to receive case management or peer support has the opportunity to be much more just and inclusive of all Dane County residents, if we reconsider all options to add positions to DCDHS.
