11 12	<u>Authorizing Law:</u> In March of 2021, the federal government authorized the \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan (ARP) stimulus bill authorizing additional funding to respond to and recover from the COVID 10 pendemic across multiple areas of peed.
13 14	the COVID-19 pandemic across multiple areas of need.
15 16 17 18 19 20 21	Dane County was allocated over \$106 million in ARP local aid. A portion of those funds has been committed to various efforts to prevent and end homelessness and limit spread of COVID-19. Funding was authorized in the 2022 Dane County Budget to assist with services for households experiencing homelessness who are unsheltered (living in cars, tents, and other places not meant for human habitation, not those who are utilizing congregate or non-congregate shelter).
22 23 24 25 26 27	<u>Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic</u> : The number of people experiencing homelessness in Dane County has increased during the COVID-19 pandemic, putting additional stress on a system that was already strained beyond its capacity to serve the need. Increasing capacity to provide outreach services, including expanding services to Dane County communities outside the City of Madison, is necessary to help connect people experiencing unsheltered homelessness to critical community resources.
28 29 30 31 32	The Dane County Department of Human Services' Housing Access and Affordability Division is seeking to award a contract for these services to Catalyst for Change Inc. The vendor was selected via a competitive RFP process in 2022.
33 34 35	A contract totaling \$144,960 is required to provide services from August 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2022 through December 31, 2022.
36	Duplication of Funding/Existing Partnerships and Programs: The funding is not duplicative and
37 38	is cooperative with other outreach programs, as additional service capacity is needed in this area.
39	Expected Outcomes and Data Collection
40 41 42	Expected program outcomes include the provision of outreach services to households experiencing unsheltered homelessness in communities throughout Dane County that will lead to connections to basic needs, community resources (housing, employment, case management, hopeviared health supports, community assistance programs (Eacd Share, BadgerCare, etc.), vital
43	behavioral health supports, economic assistance programs (FoodShare, BadgerCare, etc.), vita

- 44 records, medical services, legal services, and more.
- 45 Data collection will minimally include:
- Unduplicated Number of Total Individuals served.

- Demographics of individuals served.
- Current living situation of the individual served.
- Number of participants connected to community services identified through individual
   needs assessment.
  - Number of individuals who left the program voluntarily, and where they exited to (i.e. permanent housing, transitional housing, shelter).
- Percentage of clients served without a VI-SPDAT or in need of an updated VI-SPDAT
   (i.e. current living situation) will receive a VI-SPDAT assessment and complete
   documentation required to exit program into permanent housing.

Change Inc. (term of August 15, 2022 – December 31, 2022) and that the County Executive and
County Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to sign the agreement on behalf of Dane

contract.
