Thanks to Sup. Huelsemann for her leadership on this. I want to add a few notes as to why I support her work in this and priorities I would have with this OA. I can't make it to your meeting tonight, but appreciate the work and discussion you've had and will have.

- 1) Have more than one person with lived experience on the CJC and subcommittees. One is the loneliest number. And, that's a lot of pressure to put on that person. From what I've heard from folks on this topic, it'd be good to have at least two.
- 2) Voting membership is important to show we value the persons' (with lived experience) voices.
- 3) Give speaking rights to all supervisors at CJC. This is important work. And there's so much of it to do. Supes should be encouraged to be engaged in this work as they're then best positioned to implement the policy change we need. It is my understanding Madison alders are ex officio members of all Madison committees and I don't think that creates issues for them.
- 4) I like the added structure around subcommittees.
- 5) A transparent and community generated nomination and appointment process will provide the most opportunity to empower voices of those most impacted by the harm of our racist criminal legal system and incarceration practices and policies.
