Carolyn Clow, Dep. Director of the Alliant Energy Center, spoke in support of the additional funding requested for the project. This additional amount would bring the project back to the original amount requested, which was subsequently reduced based on the belief that the labor could be performed in-house. In fact, the labor is not going to be available and so the additional cost is for contract labor.
