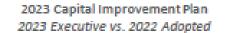

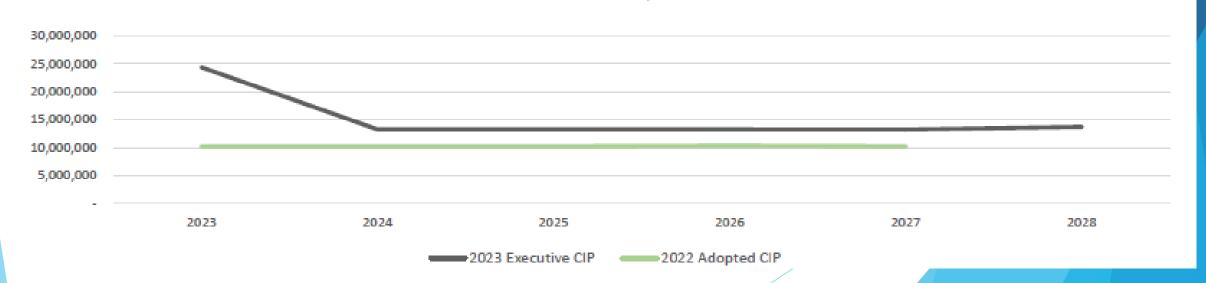

2023 Executive Capital Budget: Highlights

- Permanent men's shelter (+11M)
 - Engineering preliminary cost estimate \$21M
 - ▶ \$10M currently authorized (\$4M City GO, \$2M City ARPA, \$1M Land Acquisition Fund, \$3M County)
 - Added contributions to meet cost projection
 - > \$2M Federal Grant
 - + \$6M Dane County
 - + \$3M City GO
- Expansion of affordable housing fund (+\$3M/Yr)
 - ▶ Raises annual program fund level to \$10M
 - Authorizes use of program funds for ongoing costs to administer the AHF
 - Draws on TID cash contributions

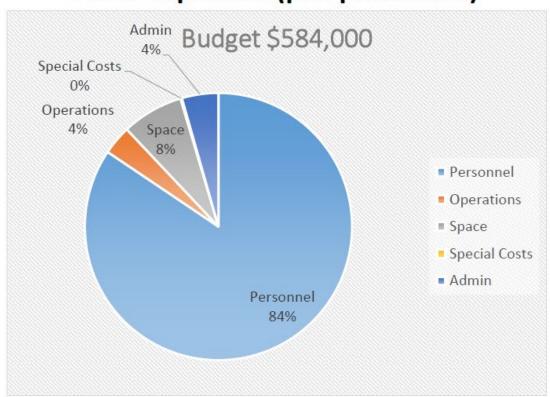

Mayor's 2023 Operating Budget Instructions

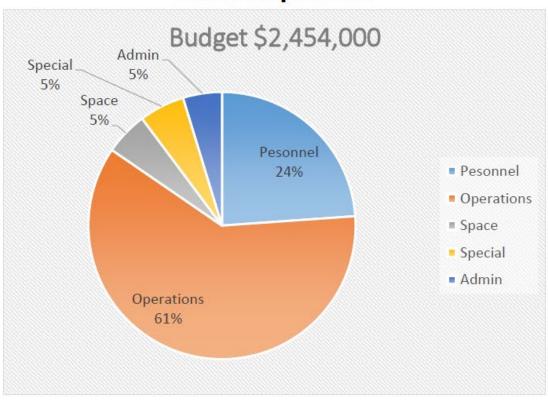
- Reduce levy-funded expenditures by 1%
 - ► Translates to \$150K in CDD budget
 - ► Achieved through 1.4% cuts to all purchase of service contracts
 - Unlikely to be incorporated into Executive Budget
- ▶ Able to submit one supplemental spending request
 - ▶ CDD request additional funding for young adult employment programs
- Address existing budget gaps
 - Operational costs of Temporary Men's Shelter
 - Continuation of Dairy Drive Urban Campground
 - Currently supported with Federal funds
