Supervisor Ratcliff spoke in support of the resolution, indicating that while PFAS is prohibited in products in the U.S., it is still in products produced in other countries, which are used in the U.S. Because of this, PFAS is being found everywhere in the environment. The statewide Clear Act would allow local governmental agencies the ability to put policies in place to address PFAS pollution and to access additional resources.

Chair Eicher indicated that this resolution will be placed before the full County Board in tandem with the County Board's other PFAS resolution for board consideration.
