CJC MEMBER INITIATIVES

- The Sheriff is piloting electronic monitoring as a replacement to Huber, such that incarcerated people on work release do not have to return to the jail in the evening.
- Implement jail population review team to identify people who have been incarcerated for a longer period of time and work with stakeholders to discuss opportunities for release (if appropriate). Review for potential system changes and individual potential release.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SUBCOMMITTEE: FAMILIAR FACES



- Began pilot of Familiar Faces Booking Alert project to notify behavioral health professionals when a familiar face client is booked into jail.
- Accepted to the national Familiar Faces Initiative cohort, increasing opportunities to support justiceinvolved people cycling between jail, hospitals, and law enforcement
- Next quarter: Continue pilot of Booking Alert project (CJC team, DCSO, DHS, and Dane IT)
- Debrief of Familiar Faces—Lucas County, OH

PRETRIAL SERVICES SUBCOMMITTEE MEETINGS AND TOPICS

6/29: CJC-Pretrial Services Meeting:

- Discussion of Advancing Pretrial Policy and Research (APPR) technical assistance award
- Community conversation planning about pretrial process
- Discussion of new Pretrial Services department
- Future research goals

PRETRIAL SERVICES SUBCOMMUNEE: PRETRIAL PRACTICE AND IMPROVEMENTS

- CJC Coordinator Clark-Bernhardt and CJC Research and Innovation team work with researchers across the country to improve pretrial practice, including the Harvard Access to Justice Lab, Advancing Pretrial Policy & Research (APPR), and MDRC.
- Technical Assistance Grant awarded to the CJC for best practices in pretrial (peer supports, decision framework, most serious offense list, and more!)
- Next quarter: The CJC is considering a community conversation on pretrial best practice in December 2022 or January 2023 with national leaders APPR.



PRETRIAL SERVICES SUBCOMMITTEE: DATA



- Validate data to be used by Access to Justice Lab at Harvard Law School for the Public Safety Assessment (PSA) study
- Use technical assistance from Advancing Pretrial Policy & Research (APPR) to explore opportunities to improve pretrial services
- Begin updated cash bail analysis to examine impact of cash bail on low-level misdemeanants immediately following jail booking
- Next quarter: Finalize the PSA data work with with Harvard Access to Justice Lab

PRETRIAL SERVICES SUBCOMMITTEE: WEEKEND INITIAL APPEARANCE (IA) COURT

- Initial discussion of analyzing the need for a weekend IA court August 10th CJC Pretrial Services subcommittee meeting (https://bit.ly/3r0ss7X).
 Chair Esqueda and Coordinator Clark-Bernhardt have met with the Milwaukee County Court Intake Coordinator regarding their 7-day/week IA.
- Next quarter: Examine opportunities for weekend initial appearance. This includes review of case specific data focused on eligible releases over weekends—likely lower level misdemeanants.

- Begin recruitment for Director of Pretrial Services Department
- Explore opportunity to implement peer support specialists into pretrial services resources

RACIAL DISPARITIES SUBCOMMUNITY: COMMUNITY COURT/COMMUNITY JUSTICE CENTER

- Building on work of the needs assessment completed by Center for Court Innovation
- Discussion forthcoming around potential clientele of the community justice center/community court
- Discussion forthcoming around potential service array for clients.
- Discussion of monitoring of community court clients.

- CJC applied for a national grant for Community Courts (600K) with start date in late fall 2022.
- Review of national community court listserv and message boards around metrics and successful programming of community courts.

PAST OPPORTUNITIES LEAD TO FUTURE WORK

- Cities and Counties for Fine and Fee Justice:
 - Dane County was highlighted for past work in youth justice. Attendees included
 Esqueda, Eicher, Clark-Bernhardt
 - Delivered example contract (and negotiations) to DCSO –SF example:
 - UW and DCSO collaborative work around connecting families to jail residents via video calls
 - The opportunity to be part of national group
 - Interrupt inter-generational harm
