DANE COUNTY 2022 EMERGENCY HARM REDUCTION AND PREVENTION ACT DCDHS - ACS DIVISION

Deaths involving opioids, particularly fentanyl have been steadily increasing in Dane County since 2016. In 2021, 149 people in Dane County passed away due to opioid-related overdoses - reflecting 86% of all overdose deaths. Opioid-related deaths in Dane County have increased more than 30% in the past five years. Overall, overdose deaths involving fentanyl are up close to 70% in that same time frame. Fentanyl was determined to be a contributing factor in over three quarters of the county's overdose deaths in 2021. According to the Public Health of Madison and Dane County's 2022 Annual Report on Drug Overdose Deaths, the age-adjusted drug overdose death rate among Black people was more than three times the rate among White people from 2018-2020. In comparison to other races, Black people have experienced sharp increases in drug overdose death rates in the past decade.

Funds from the settlement of lawsuits with opioid manufacturers have recently come through to Dane County. There was a total of \$1.5 million included in the 2022 adopted budget to support treatment and peer support activities. As a result of this settlement, the additional available funds will be used for harm reduction and overdose prevention activities. The federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration defines harm reduction as an approach that emphasizes engaging directly with people who use drugs to prevent overdose and infectious disease transmission, improve the physical, mental, and social wellbeing of those served, and offer low-threshold options for accessing substance use disorder treatment and other health care services. Two organizations that are heavily involved in these harm reduction activities in Dane County are Safe Community Coalition of Madison and Dane County (a.k.a.: Safe Communities) and Outreach.

Outreach will receive \$50,000 of these funds to strengthen the Pride in Prevention Coalition, creating increased awareness and prevention services to populations disproportionately impacted by overdoses and by fentanyl poisoning.

Safe Communities has access to a vast network of coalitions, providers, and recovery coaches by which it can make sure resources such as fentanyl test strips and naloxone can make it into the hands of those individuals who need it most. Safe Communities will subcontract with the African American Opioid Coalition of Dane County for \$100,000. This coalition is a project developed in collaboration with Safe Communities and was formed to address racial disparities affecting African Americans with respect to disparate impacts of opioid addiction on Black families and communities in Madison and Dane County. Safe Communities will also work with the dozen Senior Focal Points in Dane County to distribute up to \$15,000 worth of harm reduction tools and medication lock boxes for those in need. Safe Communities will also work with local providers serving those who are experiencing homelessness and with the Recovery Coalition of Dane County to distribute up to \$10,000 worth of harm reduction tools in each area. Finally, Safe Communities has also been coordinating with local school districts to implement the use of the Life Skills Training, a research based prevention curriculum for high school and

Safe Community Coalition of Madison and Dane County 2022 SCHEDULE A PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS Opiate Prevention Programs #9296 & 9297

A. Description of Services to be Purchased:

Community Prevention (SPC 408)

The provision of services to the general public or targeted segments of the public for the primary purpose of preventing disabilities or social and community problems and promoting mental or physical health and improved social and community functioning. Services, which are typically provided to groups at risk, or the community at-large, include but are not limited to: public information, and education/training. Includes a wide variety of activities designed to make constructive changes in community conditions to help prevent disabilities or social or community problems as well as the development of positive youth programs and/or self-help groups. Includes the providing of factual information on disabilities and their prevention, on family and social problems and on good health and living practices. Includes the development and use of school and other curricula and printed and audiovisual educational and training materials which focus on the prevention of disorders and the coordination of all aspects of programming with other community agencies and groups.

1. Service Location: Services shall be provided at PROVIDER'S office location at 2453 Atwood Ave. Madison, WI 53704 and other locations in Dane County.

2. Persons to be Served

- **a.** Target Population: This is a public information, education and prevention program for which there are no direct service clients.
- Funding Source: This program is fully funded by Dane County Opiate Lawsuit Settlement revenue. PROVIDER shall comply with all requirements associated with the funding source.
- 4. Units of Service: A unit of service is defined as one staff hour.

B. Program Specifications

- 1. Service Specifications. The PROVIDER shall:
 - a. Increase awareness and public education about the dangers of fentanyl and opiates through information dissemination techniques focused on harm reduction to prevent death from drug poisoning. This may include, but is not limited to, media campaigns, public service announcements/advertisements, speaking engagements, brochures and other promotional materials, and public engagement at community events.
 - b. Organize and facilitate the African American Opioid Coalition (AAOC), a multi-sector community coalition to address to disparate impacts of opioid

addiction on Black families and communities Dane County. Under the direction of the AAOC:

- i. Provide free, 24-7 access to naloxone, fentanyl test strips, medication lock boxes and recovery coaching. With guidance from community members and informed by overdose data, AAOC will install up to 75 Overdose Aid Kit (OAK) boxes at key locations to provide easy access to free naloxone and fentanyl test strips along with treatment and recovery resources.
- ii. Launch culturally competent harm reduction messaging to be delivered via trusted community institutions. With media and communication partners, AAOC will develop and launch a culturally competent harm reduction campaign to be delivered through trusted community institutions, including Black churches, nonprofit organizations, media outlets and treatment providers. The campaign's focus will be to highlight risk of fentanyl-laced counterfeit prescription pills, cocaine and meth, and to promote OAK box and other pick up locations for free naloxone and fentanyl test strips; The campaign will also advertise national 'Never Use Alone' service and phone number. Budget to be determined, but will include campaign development, media buys, coordination and partner stipends.
- c. Purchase and distribute opiate prevention and harm reduction materials and supplies in partnership with community organizations and coalitions including the Area Agency on Aging and Senior Focal Points, the Recovery Coalition of Dane County, and local providers serving individuals experiencing homelessness.
- d. Facilitate the delivery of primary prevention education through evidencebased school curricula, including Botvin LifeSkills and Safety First: Real Drug Education for Teens. Pilot the launch of these courses at up to 2 area school districts.
- 2. PROVIDER Responsibilities. During the term of this Agreement, PROVIDER shall: Submit quarterly progress reports on April 10th, July 10th, October 10th and a final report due January 10th of the year following the contract period. All materials purchased and created with COUNTY's funds are to be submitted with the progress reports including a brief expense report indicating how the county funds were spent. All reports are to be mailed or electronically sent to the COUNTY's contract manager

C. Program Evaluation

- 1. Goals: The goal of the services is reduce and prevent opiate use and the harms and negative consequences resulting from opiate use.
- 2. Performance Indicators: Specific performance indicators will be determined by joint agreement of PROVIDER and COUNTY.
