GRANTING THE AIRPORT DIRECTOR AUTHORITY TO APPROVE PANDEMIC RELATED GRANTS AND PROVIDE TEMPORARY WAIVERS TO CONTRACT TERMS TO ASSIST TENANTS, OPERATORS AND CONCESSIONAIRES IN MAINTAINING OPERATIONS AND EMPLOYEES AT THE DANE COUNTY REGIONAL AIRPORT

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The coronavirus pandemic continues to have an evolving impact on virtually every facet of our 8 lives, and has been declared a public health emergency on a worldwide, national, and local 9 basis. Authorities at all levels are issuing and regularly modifying far reaching restrictions on 10 commerce, travel, work, and recreation in efforts to contain and delay the spread of the virus. 11 Dane County has not been spared the extreme and unforeseeable effects of COVID-19, not only 12 as it directly affects Dane County citizens and employees, but also in the manner the virus has 13 14 impacted the many organizations and businesses that furnish important services under contract with the County. 15

As governments, businesses, families, and individuals make decisions curtailing travel and 16 gatherings during the pandemic, airports and the many firms and individuals working in the air 17 travel industry have seen a precipitous decline in demand for air travel related goods and 18 services. As airlines throughout the world drastically reduce and cancel flights, the Dane County 19 20 Regional Airport (the "Airport") has seen its commercial passenger numbers reduced by approximately 95%. Every lost passenger is not only lost to the Airport, but is also lost to the 21 many businesses and employees that rely on air travelers for economic survival. Thus, the 22 drastic decline in passenger traffic has not only decimated the airline industry, it has severely 23 24 undermined, or even eliminated, related demand for services and goods offered by Airport tenants, operators, and concessionaires including, but certainly not limited to, retail sales, 25 restaurants, and rental car services. Additionally, building owners and tenants in the Truax Air 26 Park, a business and office park administered by the Airport, are experiencing shortfalls in 27 28 business and rental income that threaten their ability to make timely payments under their leases 29 with Dane County.

30 As is the case with airports around the nation, Airport tenants, operators, and concessionaires 31 have requested accommodations to mitigate the financial impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, such as rent adjustment or abatement, and premises modifications. The Federal Aviation 32 Administration, the regulatory agency controlling the nation's aviation industry, has concluded 33 34 that certain accommodations based on pandemic related conditions are permissible under federal law. Airport management has determined that short term financial adjustments may be 35 appropriate in some circumstances so that Airport tenants, operators, and concessionaires can 36 remain solvent, keep their workers actively employed, and be available to provide necessary 37 services when Airport passenger levels return to pre-crisis levels. 38

Further, in recognition that the coronavirus pandemic directly impacts the financial viability of 39 each of the nation's airports, as well as the livelihood of those who offer services to the users of 40 those airports, the Federal Government has enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic 41 Security ("CARES") Act. Under the CARES Act, the Airport may qualify for monetary aid to help 42 43 it sustain operations and development through the period of economic disruption caused by COVID-19. To avail itself of funds under the CARES Act or other similar programs that may be 44 adopted, the Airport will have to promptly submit applications, financial and planning 45 documentation, and comply with various certification and reporting requirements. In some 46 47 cases, the timeframes and deadlines established to qualify for airport aid and relief funding may be very difficult to meet under Dane County's sometimes lengthy approval processes. The 48 Airport Director and her staff have the capability to promptly prepare the documentation required 49 to apply for airport relief funding and, under an appropriate delegation of authority, the Airport 50 Director could approve, execute, and directly submit relief funding applications in a timely 51 52 manner.

53 Any accommodations made for tenants or applications made for funding, will be listed and 54 reported to the Airport Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Dane County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes, until 12/31/2020, the Airport Director to approve and execute on behalf of Dane County documents granting short term waivers or accommodations related to contractual provisions that the Airport Director determines to be appropriate due to conditions arising from the present COVID-19 pandemic and affecting Airport tenants, operators, and concessionaires; and

61 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Airport Director is hereby authorized to prepare, approve, 62 and execute on behalf of Dane County applications, certifications and documentation related to 63 obtaining aid and funding for the Airport that may become available under governmental 64 enactments and programs providing relief from the economic disruption caused by the 65 coronavirus pandemic.
