Winter offers a variety of recreational opportunities for you to enjoy the natural beauty of the Dane County Park system.

Miles of specially groomed trails offer cross-country skiers spectacular views and ideal conditions.

Dane County Parks provides winter access to many snowshoe trails, and several parks contain excellent sledding hills. If you're interested in winter mountain biking (permit **required)**, we even have a venue for that! Please see map on the reverse side for activity locations.

Winter is also the perfect time for following animal tracks in the snow, taking quiet walks, ice fishing, or observing winter birds, wildlife and plants. Winter hiking, snowshoeing, and dog walking opportunities are available at most parks. Please respect skiers and stay off groomed ski trails. Dogs require a Dane County dog permit and must be on-leash unless in a designated off-leash dog park.

Trail Users

- 1. Hiking, dog walking, and snowshoeing are **not** allowed on groomed cross-country ski trails.
- 2. Most trails are marked for one-way use. Please follow directions when using trails.
- Trails are color-coded and numbered to delineate loops or segments.
- Detailed cross-country ski trail maps are available on the Parks website.

General Park Rules


- 1. Parks are open daily from 5 am to 10 pm.
- 2. Vehicles are restricted to designated roadways and parking areas.
- 3. All trash must be removed from the parks or deposited in appropriate containers.

Permit Information

- 1. Trail users age 16+ are required to purchase a daily or annual trail permit to use groomed Dane County and City of Madison ski trails and Dane County mountain bike trails.
- 2. No permit is required for snowshoeing or cross-country skiing on ungroomed trails.
- 3. All dog owners must purchase a dog permit to bring their dog(s) into a County park. All dogs must be on-leash unless in a designated offleash dog park.
- Accessing any Dane County Parks lake access site for ice fishing requires a Dane County lake access permit. (Wisconsin State Park Vehicle Admission Stickers are also accepted at the William G. Lunney Lake Farm lake access site in the Capital Springs

Permits are available at trailheads, dog parks, lake access sites, the Dane County Parks website (www.danecountyparks.com), by phone at (608) 224-3730, and in person at the Dane County Parks Office.




A daily or annual cross-country ski permit is required which is also good for City of Madison ski trails. McCarthy County Park also offers cross-country ski trails groomed by volunteers; no permit is required. Cross-country skiing is allowed at locations other than designated sites; however, trails are not groomed, so conditions may not be ideal.


Winter hiking, snowshoeing, and on-leash dog walking opportunities are available at most parks. Please respect skiers and stay off groomed ski trails.




