## 2023 RES-172 ACKNOWLEDGING INDIGENOUS PEOPLES DAY ON OCTOBER 9, 2023

**WHEREAS**, Indigenous Peoples' Day commemorates five hundred years of survival and renewal of Indigenous people and cultures in the face of political and cultural repression; and

WHEREAS, there are 574 federally recognized tribes living within the United States, 11 here in Wisconsin; and

**WHEREAS,** Indigenous Peoples' Day is an opportunity to remember historical truths about the devastating loss of life, displacement, and oppression of Indigenous people in our county, state, and country, to organize against current injustices, and celebrate Indigenous resilience; and

**WHEREAS**, the land that would later become known as Dane County, Wisconsin, is located on the ancestral and traditional lands of the Ho-Chunk, Sauk, and Kickapoo nations, where Indigenous people and cultures flourished and established sustainable ways of living based on cooperation among neighbors and respect for the land and for all living creatures; and

**WHEREAS,** these Indigenous people and cultures were disrupted, violated, and destroyed, as much of Dane County and its institutions were built directly upon the original homelands, villages, and sacred sites of the Indigenous peoples of this region; and yet, with great resilience, Dane County's Indigenous residents and their cultures have survived.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Dane County Board of Supervisors does hereby acknowledge October 9, 2023, as Indigenous Peoples' Day across Dane County and offers its gratitude to the native people of this hemisphere and this region on behalf of all County residents, in recognition of their care for this land, their cultures and ways of being, and their continuing vibrancy and contributions to our civic life in Dane County and beyond.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Dane County Board of Supervisors acknowledges its responsibility and reasserts its commitment to oppose the systematic racism toward Indigenous people in the United States, which perpetuates high rates of poverty and income inequality, exacerbating disproportionate health, education, and social crises, and to partner and collaborate with tribal governments and peoples to accomplish this commitment.

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the Dane County Board of Supervisors does hereby commit in the coming year to developing and implementing more permanent visible acknowledgments of Dane County's Indigenous people and cultures, increasing communication with its Indigenous residents and with those nations who occupied this land, and promoting the culture, language, and traditions of our tribal brothers and sisters across our county.
