9. REPORTS TO COMMITTEE

Operations Division 9.1 2014

- -The division was asked to review the department hiring process to improve it along with considering equity issues.
- -The software used by the Employee Relations at the County is one barrier to applicants.
- -A meeting of county staff will be convened to look at equity in the employment process.

Environmental Health Division 9.2 2014

- -The Director asked staff to prepare for accreditation. The section now has an AHEC student helping us develop a plan for the Voluntary National Retail Food Regulatory program standards, which will align us with accreditation.
- -We are close to developing an on line application for temporary restaurant events. There are approximately 2500-3000 requested per year.
- -If you have a chance, check out our online inspection reports, we would appreciate feedback. Doug will send out the link to our website.
- -After the Administrative Hearing final decision was issued, Beryl's owner euthanized the dog. We may have two additional Dangerous Animal decisions/appeals coming.
- -John Hausbeck is working with Madison Kipp Corp. and city staff to revise the current lease that will include long term monitoring to ensure no further contamination of the rain garden and assure that the ground surface is clear of contamination.
- -There are approximately 200 sites in Dane County identified as contaminated by PCE, usually associated with dry cleaners. DNR is the lead on these.
- -Wisconsin fund is money used for low income people with POWTS systems failing, who get reimbursed from this fund. This was eliminated in the state budget.
- -We held a Plumbers meeting on March 4 which we educated them on the use of Aerobic Treatment Units. Proper maintenance is needed to assure they are working.
- -Currently we are monitoring three low risk travelers for Ebola, with a total of 48 having been monitored so far.
- -Tristen, Doug and Amanda are all attending the CDC emergency preparedness conference in Atlanta next week.

Community Health Division 9.3 2014 RPT-104

- -We received \$220,000 from Susan G Komen South Central for the Treatment Access Fund to staff support for women need screening that is not provided in WI Well Women Program, supportive services for uninsured or those not on Medicare.
- -With the retirement of one of our Public Health Supervisors, Cheryl Robinson, there will be changes in structure.
- -The Immunization Program will be moved to Public Health Supervisor Kate Louther's section.
- -Sue Marshall, our WIC Supervisor, will oversee the breastfeeding program.
- -Karri Bartlett, currently a PPE Supervisor will lead sexual and reproductive health, STI/ HIV and the WWWP programs.
- -Staffing needs will be filled internally with staff shifting FTE, including some shifts of PHN hours to Admin staff.
- -Between now and June 1 will be building out staffing models.
- -With the Affordable Care Act there is a requirement to do a community health needs assessment. We are working with the hospitals on this. Part of this is to survey broadly. Please use the link on our website to complete and share.
