# AAA Legislative/Advocacy Committee Recommendation to the AAA Board

The Legislative/Advocacy Committee recommends the AAA Board forward a resolution to the Dane County Board of Supervisors opposing the Governor's proposed budget changes to Aging and Disability Resource Centers and SeniorCare and the precipitous elimination of the CIP and COP waivers in accord with the 2016-2017 Dane County Legislative Agenda, Services to Older Adults, the Developmentally/Physically Disabled and Mentally Ill Section, Item 6 and the Local Government Services Section, Item 16.

## **DRAFT Resolution**

Whereas Dane County believes all its citizens who rely on publicly-funded long-term care services should have access to quality services and the ability to make individual choices about these services; and

Whereas Dane County believes that local control in providing services to older adults and residents with developmental/physically disability as well as service- administration and delivery in Aging and Disability Resource Centers (ADRC's) is essential for the citizens of Dane County: therefore

Be it resolved the Dane County Board of Supervisors opposes the Governor's proposed budget changes to SeniorCare, privatizing Aging and Disability Resource Centers, and the precipitous elimination of the CIP and COP waivers.
