CDBG Commission – Application Review Team (ART)

CDBG Commission - ART Subcommittee

- ▶ Dane County Ordinance Chapter 15.40
- Comprised of up to five, but no fewer than two, members appointed by the CDBG Commission Chair (typically at the January meeting)
- Members serve a one-year term
- ► ART scores applications submitted in response to the annual CDBG application process.

Scope (with Staff and CDBG Commission):

- Review project areas for funding
- Recommend RFP Application Evaluation Criteria
- ► May determine other process items, (e.g. funding limits & allocations)
- Applicant Interviews
- Preliminary Funding Recommendations
- ► In-person public meetings



CDBG/HOME Funding Available + Program Areas

CDBG and HOME Federal Grant Awards:

- ► ~\$1.1 Million CDBG Annual Funds
 - ► Administrative = 20% of Total CDBG Funds
 - Public Services = 15% (Public Services Minimum Request \$5,000 Max Request \$50,000)
 - ► Urgent Need = 5%
- ~\$500,000 HOME Annual Funds (does not include CHDO Funds)
 - ► Administrative = 10% of Total HOME Funds
 - ► Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) = 15%

RFP Program Areas are determined by:

- Consolidated Plan
- ▶ Data & CAPER
- Community Input & Needs

CDBG Request for Proposal (RFP) & Application Process

- ► RFP Program Areas determined by staff and approved by CDBG Commission
- ► Application Evaluation Criteria created by staff and approved by CDBG Commission
- Applications submitted by interested parties in OpenGov
- ► After application due date, ART reads, evaluates and scores all applications
- Applicant Interviews
- ART meets and makes preliminary funding recommendations
- ► CDBG Commission reviews and approves preliminary funding recommendations
- Publish recommendations
- Public Hearing and CDBG Commission meeting to approve final funding recommendations
- ► Legislative Process: Resolution to Board of Supervisors for approval and County Executive signature

Review CAPER & Determine Next Year Project Areas	March (public hearing)
Review and approve Application Evaluation Criteria	April
RFPs Issued	April – May
RFP Workshops – open to any interested agency	April – May
Applications/Proposals due in Open Gov	June
Application Review Team reads applications	June – July
Applicant Interviews	July – August
ART Meeting – Preliminary Funding Recommendations	August
CDBG Commission Meeting – Approve Preliminary Funding Recs	September
Public Hearing / CDBG Commission Approves Funding Recs	October
Resolution & Legislative Process	November – January
Grant Year Begins	January 1st

- ► Legislative Process to approve funding recommendations by resolution may take 2 months, depending on committee meeting schedules
- Contract Drafting and signatures: January April
- ► Current program year Grant Award notification from HUD: May
- ► Annual Action Plan: July
- Receive HUD grant funds in our grants management system: September
