## Land Division Review

Re: Windsor Blue (preliminary plat)

Town of Windsor, Section 30

(13 residential lots and 3 outlots, 10.77 acres) *Review deadline – December 15. 2014.* 

Staff recommends the following conditions that will be applicable in approving the preliminary plat.

- 1. Rezone Petition #10649 is to become effective and all conditions established are to be timely satisfied.
  - Recording of an approved Plat.
  - Recording of Deed Restrictions
  - The petitioner shall comply with the conditions listed in the Town of Windsor resolutions.
- 2. Compliance with the Dane County Comprehensive Plan is to be established.
  - See Pam Andros, Senior Planner letter dated September 23, 2014.
- 3. The public park land appropriation requirement is to be satisfied (private park land does not satisfy this requirement).
- 4. All public land dedications are to be clearly designated "dedicated to the public."
- 5. Lots 1 thru 6, 12 and 13 are within the shoreland zone. (Lands, which are within 300' from the OHWM of the Yahara River.
  - Shoreland erosion control permits will be required from Land Conservation.
- 6. Outlots 1 and 2 and lots 12 and 13 do not meet the public road frontage requirements with respect to Ch. 75.19 (6)(b).
  - Every lot or parcel shall front or abut a public street. Conventional lots shall maintain a minimum frontage of 66-feet to facilitate the possible development of a public right-of-way that could serve additional lots.
- 7. If it is the purpose to combine Outlots 1 and 2 with lots 1 and 2 of CSM 13005, a rezone and a new Certified Survey Map will be required.
- 8. Utility easements are to be provided.

- 9. Compliance with Ch. 14.45 DCCO, Erosion Control Plans is to be established.
- 10. Compliance with Ch. 14.46 DCCO, Stormwater Control Permits is to be established.
- 11. Town of Windsor approval is to be obtained.
- 12. Village of DeForest approval is to be obtained (extraterritorial jurisdiction).
