OVERVIEW

Dane County Parks posted a public survey for feedback on the 2025-2030 Parks and Open Space plan update. The survey opened on January 29th, 2024 and closed on May 1st, 2024 and available in both English and Spanish.


The survey link was posted on the Dane County Parks website and staff distributed flyers with QR codes to the public at events including, Wisconsin Fishing Expo, Centro Hispano, Parks and Open Space public information meetings held in West, Central, and East Dane County, and other Land and Water Resources Department (LWRD) led events.

There were a total of


1,958 responses.

Comparatively, the 2018-2023 Parks and Open Space survey received 1,195 responses.




DEMOGRAPHICS

(1,704 responses, 254 skipped)




Survey respondents by race/ethnicity as compared to the Dane County race/ ethnicity demographics




Average time respondents are willing to drive to a park



What activities do respondents like (1,434 responses, 524 skipped)


