F. Presentations

a. Dane County Pollinator Protection Plan

Presenters Mindy Habecker and David Liebl

In 2014, the Dane County Board of Supervisors created a task force to investigate declining pollinator populations. Their charge was to assess honeybee health issues and the future stability of agricultural products that are dependent on pollination. The Dane County Pollinator Protection Task Force (DCPPTF) collected information on the local pollinators and developed a plan that outlined future pollinator protection and educational efforts within Dane County.

G. Reports to Committee

a. Patrick Marsh and North Mendota Natural Resource Area land exchange with Natural Heritage Land Trust

Hicklin provided an overview of a potential land exchange between Dane County and the Natural Heritage Land Trust. She stated that the Commission had reviewed this potential exchange in the past as staff explored the opportunity. Hicklin explained that the exchange of properties is being proposed to create greater efficiency and streamline project work for both agencies. Dane County would take over lands associated with the North Mendota Natural Resource Area and the Natural Heritage Land Trust would take over properties within the Patrick Marsh Natural Resource Area; adding that Dane County will still be involved to assist with potential acquisitions or other planning at Patrick Marsh. Hicklin then went on to identify the County properties located within the Patrick Marsh and the North Mendota Natural Resource Areas. Jim Welsh, Natural Heritage Land Trust identified the lands owned and managed by the Land Trust within the two Natural Resource Areas and discussed the work their agency was working on. Welsh provided some history on the Welke Preserve, a donation, and the purpose for the donation.
