

1. An opponent to issuance of a conditional use permit (CUP) may register as such with the Committee at the public hearing on the permit.
  - a. Where an organization is the lead opponent of an action, that organization may designate one or more points of contact for further actions on the permit.
  - b. Where there are multiple individuals speaking in opposition to issuance of the permit, committee staff shall attempt to consolidate those individuals so that the committee has one or two primary points of contact as proceedings on the permit go forward.
2. All members of the public who are present at the public hearing on a CUP may testify at the public hearing on the proposal to issue the permit.
3. At subsequent work meetings where the CUP is discussed further, a registered opponent of the issuance of the permit may supplement the record.
  - a. The committee shall allow limited oral testimony from the registered opponent or opponents of the permit issuance at the work meetings where the CUP is discussed.
  - b. The registered opponent may supplement the record by submitting written testimony at the work meetings where the CUP is discussed.
  - c. Materials received via e-mail between meetings are not automatically entered into the record. If a member of the committee chooses to do so, he or she may make a motion to enter one or more documents received between meetings into the record.
