 - -Implement an operational philosophy that includes a comprehensive plan that allows an agency's daily operations to assist in better managing inmate behavior

EDUCATION

-Elements

- 1. Assessment of risk and needs
- 2. Assign inmates to housing
- 3. Meeting inmates' basic needs
- 4. Defining and conveying expectation for behavior
- 5. Supervising inmates
- 6. Keeping inmates productively occupied

RESTRICTIVE HOUSING DEFINITIONS


- Removal from general population, whether voluntary or involuntary;
- Placement in a locked room or cell, whether alone or with another inmate; and
- Inability to leave a cell for the vast majority of the day, typically 22 hours or more.
- Temporary vs. Extended Restrictive Housing

REASONS FOR RESTRICTIVE HOUSING


- Behavior
 - Objective/evidence based criteria included in Classification assessment
- Medical Assessment
 - Medical staff recommendation
- Mental Health Assessment
 - Mental health recommendation
- Voluntary Request
 - -Protective Custody

RESTRICTIVE HOUSING DATA

- Placement in Temporary RH pending a disciplinary hearing.
- Maximum penalties for specific jail rule violations.
- Review initial placement in Temporary RH by a Supervisor.
- Removal from Temporary RH to general population pending disciplinary hearing.

REVIEW PROCESS FOR INMATES IN RESTRICTED HOUSING

- Jail Sgt. conducts weekly reviews on inmates in Extended RH
 - Implement daily reviews on inmates in temporary RH
- Mental Health staff
 - Weekly face to face contact with inmates in RH
 - Implement clinical evaluation/review every 30 days for inmates in Extended RH-mental health
- Medical staff
 - Face to face contact 3x per week with inmates in RH
 - Review <u>all</u> inmates placed in RH

REVIEW PROCESS OF INMATES IN RESTRICTED HOUSING

- Special Management Review team (SPIRS)
 - Captain, Lieutenants, Sergeants, Mental Health,
 Medical, Classification
 - Reviews completed every other week
 - Reviews include inmates in Extended RH-mental health
 - Implement weekly reviews
 - Implement reviews to include <u>all</u> inmates in Extended RH

CONDITIONS OF CONFINEMENT

- Seek ways to increase time out of cell for inmates in Extended RH due to mental health, medical and voluntary/protective custody
- Seek alternative housing options for inmates in Extended RH due to mental health, medical and voluntary/protective custody

REMOVAL FROM RESTRICTED HOUSING

- Objective guidelines for maximum time spent in Extended RH due to behavior
- Continue with the orientation process
- Continue behavioral plans for inmates requiring Extended RH
- Continue step down programs for inmates in Extended RH
