## **SCLS** News

ILS - The Cataloging Agreement with Madison is under review this year by a committee looking to update it. It will be approved at the June 1 ILS Committee meeting.

Koha improvements are focused on the Get It acquisitions program with focus on Credit Memos and bug fixes. SCLS staff expects that the Code-based fusion, which was tentatively scheduled for this fall, will be pushed off.

Technology – Tech Services is looking at proposing a full-time Data Services position that will focus on report writing and administration.

The Cost Formula Workgroup has made recommendations for ERate reimbursements, and charging for iBoss filtering software, adding devices onto the network, ILS startup costs and Get It. The actual formula will remain intact.
