

1 SUB 1 to 2020 RES-217  
2 URGING THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-MADISON TO  
3 DISCONTINUE IN PERSON CLASSES  
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6 Coronavirus (COVID-19) has infected millions worldwide, with nearly seven million cases and  
7 over 200,000 deaths in the United States, and over nine thousand cases in Dane County. The  
8 return of students to the University of Wisconsin-Madison has resulted in cases not only among  
9 the student body, but also in the community at large. The following timeline traces the  
10 ramifications of UW-Madison's decisions:  
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- 12 • On June 17th, 2020, University of Wisconsin - Madison Chancellor Rebecca Blank sent a  
13 university-wide communication titled "Planning a Smart Restart for UW-Madison," which  
14 indicated an executive decision to welcome students back on campus.  
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- 16 • On August 24th, more than a third of the Dane County Board of Supervisors and nearly  
17 half of the Madison City Council signed a letter expressing their concern with UW -  
18 Madison's plan to reopen, demanding virtual learning and public disclosure of COVID-19  
19 metrics.  
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- 21 • On September 9th, 2020, the University of Wisconsin - Madison reported a record-high  
22 290 new positive cases in one day. Public Health Madison & Dane County declared  
23 downtown Madison a high-risk area and directed residents and employees in the area to  
24 "to assume you were exposed to COVID-19 and monitor yourself for symptoms." Dane  
25 County Executive Joe Parisi sent a letter to UW System President Tommy Thompson and  
26 Chancellor Rebecca Blank imploring the leadership team to send students home and  
27 expand the testing capacity of University Health Services.  
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- 29 • Following this announcement, University of Wisconsin - Madison declared a two week  
30 quarantine for students living in residence halls Sellery and Witte and a shift to online  
31 classes from September 9th to September 25th.  
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- 33 • At this time, less than a month into the Fall semester, 7% of UW-Madison's entire student  
34 population has already tested positive for COVID-19.  
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36 It's clear that the return of UW-Madison students to campus have posed a significant risk not only  
37 for Madison-area residents, but for Dane County residents as a whole.  
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39 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, Dane County urges UW-Madison Chancellor Rebecca  
40 Blank, UW System President Tommy Thompson, Governor Tony Evers, and all affiliated  
41 administrators to adopt the following changes to the 'Smart Restart' Plan:

- 42 • Only offer online instruction until Public Health Madison & Dane County reports zero (0)  
43 cases for fourteen (14) consecutive days, with an exception only for independent study  
44 credits necessary for international students to maintain their visa status.

- 46 • After that point and until the end of the pandemic, use online instruction as the default  
47 modality, allowing departments to offer courses in-person only when pedagogically

48 necessary. Design instructional programs around offering the highest-quality education at  
49 the lowest risk for students, workers, and community members.

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- 51 • Make accessibility the default for educational delivery, providing equitable access to  
52 education for students with disabilities and/or chronic illness through universal accessible  
53 design that does not require medical documentation or an extensive application process.

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55 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Dane County Board of Supervisors urges UW-Madison  
56 Chancellor Rebecca Blank to require students test negative for Covid-19 before closing the  
57 residence halls and encouraging students to return to their homes for the safety of the greater  
58 Dane County community during the COVID-19 pandemic, with an exception for international  
59 students or students facing homelessness or an unsafe home life, who should be allowed to stay.

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61 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in light of statewide surges in COVID-19 particularly in cities  
62 with University of Wisconsin campuses, the Dane County Board of Supervisors urges Interim UW  
63 System President Tommy G. Thompson and the Wisconsin Board of Regents to consider  
64 directing other Wisconsin campuses to conduct all coursework virtually.
