AUTHORIZING RECLASSIFICATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH ANALYST TO PUBLIC HEALTH EPIDEMIOLOGIST IN PUBLIC HEALTH MADISON & DANE COUNTY

# **Policy Analysis Statement:**

### Brief Description of Proposal -

Public Health Madison & Dane County has a vacant Public Health Analyst position #2987 (P10), which we request to be reclassified into a Public Health Epidemiologist position (P11). This position is currently vacant and the Department of Administration - Employee Relations has recommended the approval of this request.

# Current Policy or Practice -

Reclassifying positions requires approval of the County Board.

#### Impact of Adopting Proposal -

With a Public Health Epidemiologist classification, we can expect the position to take on more complex tasks with greater organizational impact such as conducting epidemiological investigations, establishing and maintaining data surveillance systems, and conducting extensive consultation with and serving as an expert resource to both internal staff and leadership, and external stakeholders and community partners.

# Narrative/Assumptions about long range fiscal effect:

The difference in starting wage from a Public Health Analyst (P10) to a Public Health Epidemiologist (P11) is \$3.40, resulting in an annual difference of \$7,072 in salary expenses. The cost difference will be incorporated into the base budget starting in 2026, and will be absorbed by salary savings in 2025.
