

52 homelessness who are symptomatic/positive for COVID-19 or a close contact for a positive
53 COVID-19 case.

54 The funding is cooperative with other non-congregate shelter programs, as additional
55 space/programming is needed to maintain social distancing in the shelter system during this
56 time.

57 **Expected Outcomes and Data Collection**

58 Isolation/Quarantine Program

59 Expected program outcomes include the safe recovery and discharge of people who are positive
60 for COVID-19, and safe shelter and discharge of people who need to quarantine due to symptoms
61 prior to test results or due to being a close contact to a positive COVID-19 case. The average
62 number of people served by this program at any given time fluctuates based on COVID-19 spread
63 at any given time. More than 70 people were served at one time during the pandemic's peak in
64 the fall/winter of 2020/2021, and early during the summer of 2021 fewer than 12 people were
65 served at any given time.

66 Data collection will minimally include the number of and demographics for the people served by
67 the program.

68 Non-Congregate Hotel Shelter

69 Expected program outcomes include the provision of safe, non-congregate shelter for people
70 experiencing homelessness who are at higher risk of severe illness if they contract COVID-19.
71 Guests will receive information on how to limit their exposure to COVID-19, receive the COVID-
72 19 vaccine, and make connections to community supports such as housing, employment, medical
73 care, economic assistance programs, or other needs identified by the shelter guest.

74 Data collection will minimally include the number of and demographics for the people served by
75 the program, the average length of stay in non-congregate shelter, and program exit destinations.

76 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board requests quarterly reports
77 be shared with the members of the County Board, and that the Health and Human Needs
78 Committee review the reports on a quarterly basis and discuss how the information
79 presented addresses anticipated program outcomes.

80 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the following contract be awarded and
81 that the County Executive and County Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to sign the
82 agreement on behalf of Dane County, and that the Controller is authorized to make payments:
