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Bookmobile.

The Bookmobile has been back on the road since June. Patrons have been getting used to our modified hold pickup schedule. They



have also been participating in grab/go crafts and summer library program. We are starting a hands-off "Judge a Book by Its Cover" option at stops to feature our new items for checkout.



Dream Bus.

The Dream Bus has been visiting food sites in the neighborhoods we typically serve. We make 16 stops a week, all between 11-2pm! Response to our grab/go book/craft bags has been very good.

Staffing.

We continue to stagger staff so that most staff are working a combination of at-home and in-office. We have been successful with social distancing, mask-wearing and frequent hand-washing and sanitizing. Surfaces are wiped down regularly, both in the office and on the vehicles. We have been "meeting" remotely for staff meetings via phone, GoToMeeting & Zoom.

Beyond the Page Ripple Project.

The Ripple committee has been working in preparation for the diversity & inclusion assessments by Cream City Conservation this fall. All library staff across Dane County will be invited to participate. Libraries will then select 1-2 staff to participate in their regional equity team.

CCC will begin staff training in early 2021. We are planning for sessions to be held via webinar; this will change to in-person when COVID-19 restrictions loosen.

In August, the Ripple committee will hold a series of 3 internal discussion sessions about libraries and policing that will cover the history of policing, and libraries relationship to the police.

PSC Grant.

DCLS has applied for a fast-tracked Public Service Commission grant to fund a mobile computer lab for Allied Drive. The focus of the grant was to provide telecommunications and technology to low-income communities during the COVID-19 crises. We will be notified mid-late July about funding.
