

2017 YTD Mental Health Statistics

- On average 18.34% of inmates booked into the jail self report at booking that they take at least one psychotropic medication.
- On average, 29.35% of all inmates are on at least one psychotropic medication.
- On average, 107 inmates are considered special needs for mental health.


What is Solitary Confinement?

- Any type of housing that involves:
 - Removal from the general inmate population, whether voluntary or involuntary;
 - Placement in a locked room or cell, whether alone or with another inmate; and
 - The inability to leave a cell for the vast majority of the day, typically 23 hours in with one hour out of cell time.

Solitary Confinement is coded into five distinct

categories:

- o AC Behavioral
- o AC Medical
- o AC Mental Health
- AC Voluntary
- AC Protective Custody








Solitary Confinement by Type July 1, 2016 – June 5, 2016

Conclusion

- A small number of inmates with mental health concerns may be diverted from jail, but most cannot.
- A safe and humane environment to treat and manage special needs inmates that cannot be safely diverted is needed.
 - Provides for enhanced treatment and improved housing options.
 - Reduces the use of Solitary Confinement
 - Provides increased programming space
 - Is PREA compliant
