GRIGSBY OFFICE FOR EQUITY AND INCLUSION 4 5 6 The Dane County community recently lost a strong, forward-thinking leader and gifted champion 7 with the death of Tamara D. Grigsby. 8 A graduate of James Madison Memorial High School, she received her bachelor's degree from 9 Howard University and earned a Master's degree in Social Work from the University of 10 Wisconsin-Madison, Tamara D. Grigsby was committed—from a young age—at crafting 11 solutions to our community and nation's most challenging problems. Informed by her grounding in social work, Ms. Grigsby served in the State of Wisconsin 12 Legislature from 2005 to 2013 representing the 18<sup>th</sup> assembly district in Milwaukee. Ms. 13 Grigsby represented the 18th Assembly District with passion and vigor, serving as Chair of the 14 State Children and Families Committee. Her advocacy for her neighbors and community was 15 16 unwavering. She was known as a voice of strength and commitment to fairness for all of 17 Wisconsin's residents, especially our children. 18 Later she was the Parent and Community Engagement Manager for Milwaukee Public Schools. 19 In each role, the cornerstone of her work was racial equity, inclusion and fairness for all. Tamara D. Grigsby had worked most recently as the appointed Director of the new Dane 20 County Office for Equity and Inclusion. Prior to that, Ms. Grigsby worked as the Community 21 Outreach Coordinator for County Executive Parisi. She was instrumental in developing a series 22 of county public policy initiatives in 2015 known as "Access to Opportunity." She co-led the 23 Racial Equity and Social Justice Initiative, facilitating critical dialogues around equity and policy 24 with county staff. She provided a critical voice to the Criminal Justice Council - Racial 25 26 Disparities Sub-Committee. Her vision and strength will be sorely missed. 27 Ms. Grigsby inspired countless staff, community leaders, and residents to strive for greater 28 equity and fairness. Ms. Grigsby lead by example, always ready to move the conversation from philosophy to action that positively impacts our residents. Her ability to create equitable policy 29 30 was driven by a core belief in equity and fairness for all as an achievable goal. 31 Ms. Grigsby believed in service. She extolled the virtue of caring for the underdog, comforting 32 those in need, and public service. Her kindness, sense of humor, strength, and graciousness enriched those fortunate enough to know and work with her. 33 To honor Tamara D. Grigsby's impact on our community, as well as the State of Wisconsin, and 34 35 in appreciation of her decades of service to the State and Dane County, the Office for Equity 36 and Inclusion shall be named in honor of our native daughter. The Tamara D. Grigsby Office for Equity and Inclusion shall champion equity and fairness for all. 37
