

Committee reviewed the proposed amendments and discussed further changes as follows:

- **EMS Services:** The Committee accepted the minor grammatical change suggested.
- **Communications Surcharge for 911 Systems:** The Committee accepted the suggested change to reflect 2018 RES 330.
- **Next Generation 911:** The Committee accepted the suggested change to delete this provision.
- **Recording Fees:** The Committee determined this provision should be removed because of the Open Records provision that is already included in the Legislative Agenda.
- **First Responder Training:** The Committee accepted the removal of the parenthetical information.
- **Emergency Communications Interoperability:** The Committee accepted the suggestion to delete the provision.
- **Conceal and Carry Weapons:** The Committee accepted the update to the language as suggested. Sup. Bayrd proposed adding “public mass transportation” to the last list of location so that it reads, “facilities, community centers, health care facilities, and public mass transportation.” Committee accepted this addition.
- **State Audit Probation & Parole Program:** The Committee accepted the alternative language so that it reads as follows: “Support reforming the probation and parole program to streamline the revocation process in order to reduce days in jail”
- **Close Public Defender Eligibility Gap:** The Committee accepted the suggested changes, but also modified the language so it specifically states that the County supports an increase in public defender pay to “at least \$70 an hour.”
- **County Jail:** The Committee accepted the grammatical changes and the suggested deletion.
- **Victim-Witness Program:** The Committee rejected the proposal to combine this provision with the suggested addition regarding the Marsy’s Law provision.
- **License Fee:** The Committee discussed this provision and determined it did not have enough information to make a recommendation. Supervisor Bayrd volunteered to research the issue and make any suggested changes when the Executive Committee discusses the matter.
- **Industrial Hemp:** The Committee accepted the recommendation to remove this provision.
- **District Attorney Funding:** The Committee accepted the recommendations.
- **Legalize Marijuana:** Committee proposed updating the provision to include the 2018 results.
- **Medical Marijuana:** The Committee proposed broadening this provision to include the legalization of marijuana position referenced earlier.

- **Interstate Traffic Tickets:** The Committee determined it did not have enough information to make a recommendation, and therefore did not accept any of the suggestions.
- **Boating Laws/Boater Registration Act:** The Committee accepted the suggestion to combine these two provisions.
- **Bail and conditions of Pre-trial Release:** The Committee accepted the recommendation to include language to support efforts to reform the bail system. Supervisors Rusk and Bayrd discussed the following amendment:
  - “Support legislation that reforms bail and conditions of pretrial release that ~~enhance public safety and respects the constitutional rights of the accused, considers the costs to local governments,~~ enhances public safety and incorporates evidence based strategies.

The Committee accepted the proposed amendment.
- **Marsy’s Law:** The Committee determined it did not want accept the suggested recommendation.
- **Immigration/Drivers’ Licenses:** Sup. Danner suggested adding a new provision that would support legislation that allows undocumented immigrants to obtain drivers’ licenses. The Committee accepted Sup. Danner’s recommendation.
- **Group Homes:** Sup. Danner suggested a new provision that would support efforts to reassess the maximum daily rate that group homes receive. The Committee accepted the suggestion.
- **First Responder Training:** Sup. Danner suggested adding the phrase “as well as other adults” after the phrase “older adults” in current line 463. The Committee accepted the suggested change.
