

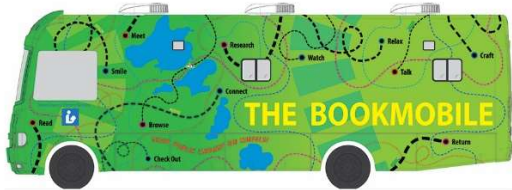


Dane County Library Service	November Director's Report
