- ADRC: Dementia Care Grant implementation; Increasing scanning/paperless functionality
- Adult Protective Services: Training and materials for guardians
- □ DD Services: HS Transition and empowerment training for DD parents and families; Summer employment for DD consumers age 18 – 21; Medication reviews for consumers with multiple medications

2015 Successes

- ☐ Inpatient Care: Facilitating admissions to BPHCC from MMHI's Gero-psychiatric Unit
- MH Services: Implementation of the CCS Program; Improving measurable program outcomes

2015 Limited or No Progress

- Alternative Sanctions: OWI Court timeliness of service; implement a risk assessment tool
- Inpatient Care: Development of a crisis home for people with dementia; controlling WMHI/MMHI costs; limiting use of out of county IMD facilities
- MH Services: Exploring contract payment methods such as units x unit cost

- was Factors driving utilization include Suicide Prevention, Lack of Access to Treatment, Willingness to Accept Treatment, Dementia Care, Community Safety, Services of Managed Care Programs

- MA Comprehensive Community Services
- July 2015 = no consumers or revenue
- \bigcirc Dec 2015 = 78 consumers
- May 2016 = 214 consumers (all ages)
- Currently revenue of \$270,000 / month and growing

- Areas needing attention include:
- Program compliance incl. complete, accurate records to prevent audit exceptions
- Adequacy of the CCS Provider Network

- **≈** 2016: \$174.4 M
- **≈** \$25.5 GPR; **\$148.9 Rev**
- **≈** 68 Distinct Revenues

- Readily Care Planning
- Need to identify steps to take to prepare for FC 2.0
- Need to plan for handling the 3 6 month transition: consumers, families, providers, ADRC role, staff coverage, etc
- **Budgetary planning: \$17 million 1st year county contribution; impact once Family Care arrives
- Impact on continuing county responsibilities, esp. Adult Protective Services & inpatient care
