Medical Director Service provided under this contract shall include the following:

- Provide medical director oversight, including protocol development and revisions of (a) Dane County Tactical Emergency Medical Services (TEMS) Protocols
- Provide and oversee ongoing training for TEMS providers, including evaluation and (b) maintenance of clinical competencies and medical procedures:
- Provide ongoing basic medical training for tactical operators, including but not (c) limited to, tourniquet application, basic wound care, and casualty immobilization and extrication:
- (d) Provide on-scene medical oversight and support for Tactical Response Team operations, including trainings and field operations;
- Provide basic retraining of field Law Enforcement Officers, including but not limited (e) to Individual First Aid Kit (IFAK) content and use, basic first aid/medical stabilization, and management of opiate overdoses/Narcan administration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that a contract is awarded to the University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation in the amount of \$109,500.93 for the term of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2028, for the provision of Medical Director Service; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute the contract on behalf of Dane County and, the Dane County Sheriff is authorized to enter into a contract with the University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation for the provision of Medical Director Service: and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED the Dane County Sheriff's Office is authorized to issue payment for this contract.

MEDICAL DIRECTOR SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN DANE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN MEDICAL FOUNDATION, INC.

This agreement ("<u>Agreement</u>") is entered into by and between Dane County Sheriff's Office ("<u>DCSO</u>") and the University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation, Inc. ("<u>UWMF</u>"), a nonstock, nonprofit corporation organized under Chapter 181 of the Wisconsin Statutes, acting on behalf of the faculty physicians in the Department of Emergency Medicine ("<u>Department</u>"), of the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health ("<u>Medical School</u>") at the University of Wisconsin-Madison ("<u>University</u>"). UWMF, the Department, the Medical School, the University, and UW Faculty Physician may be referred to collectively as the "<u>UW Actors</u>."

WHEREAS, DCSO is a law enforcement organization that desires to arrange for the provision of Medical Director Services by a physician who is a member of the faculty in the Department ("UW Faculty Physician" or "UW Faculty Physicians"); and

WHEREAS, UWMF has agreed to arrange for the provision of Medical Director Services by such UW Faculty Physician under the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, UWMF is recognized by the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System as the vehicle for support of the clinical activities and delivery of medical care by UW Faculty Physicians, collection of UW Faculty Physicians' practice income, and support for the Medical School's mission to meet the health needs of Wisconsin and beyond through excellence in education, research, patient care and service. Accordingly, UWMF has the authority to contract on behalf of UW Faculty Physicians; and

NOW THEREFORE, The parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Services.</u> UWMF shall arrange for a UW Faculty Physician to provide "<u>Medical Director Services</u>" as more thoroughly described in the attached Exhibit A, throughout the Term of this Agreement. Such Medical Director Services may be referred to as "<u>Services</u>." UWMF and the Department may assign one or more qualified UW Faculty Physician(s) to provide Services as needed.
- 2. Term. This Agreement shall be effective as of January 1, 2024 (the "Effective Date") and shall expire on December 31, 2024 ("The Initial Term"), unless earlier terminated as provided herein. Thereafter, this Agreement shall automatically renew each January 1 for up to four successive terms of one (1) year each unless either party provides written notice of non-renewal to the other party at least sixty (60) calendar days prior to the expiration of the then-current term. The Initial Term and any automatic renewals may be collectively referred to as the "Term." In the event this Agreement is terminated during any one-year period of the Term, then, during the remainder of that one-year period, the parties may not enter into a new agreement for the provision of the same services with new or different financial terms. Nothing in this Agreement prohibits the parties from entering into a new agreement or amending this Agreement covering additional services to be provided.

3. <u>Compensation.</u>

3.1. Annual Fee for Medical Director Services.

- 3.1.1 As of the Effective Date, DCSO shall pay UWMF for Medical Director Services provided under this Agreement at the rate of Twenty Thousand Six Hundred and Twenty-Five Dollars (\$20,625.00) per year. The parties acknowledge that this fee is intended to reflect fair market value for those services being provided pursuant to this Agreement and does not, nor shall it be modified to, take into account the volume or value of any referrals between the parties.
- 3.1.2. The annual fee for Medical Director Services shall be prorated for quarterly payments. Accordingly, Department shall invoice DCSO for Medical Director Services on a quarterly basis and DCSO shall pay invoices within ten (10) business days of receipt and shall send payments to the address indicated in such invoices.

3.2 Annual Fee Adjustments.

- 3.2.1 Effective January 1, 2025, and alternating January 1s thereafter (i.e., January 1, 2027), the annual fee for Medical Director Services shall increase by three percent (3%). Notwithstanding the foregoing, if DCSO has reason to believe that a three percent (3%) increase in fees would exceed fair market value, DCSO will notify UWMF in writing to request a fair market value review of fees at least three (3) months before the three percent (3%) increase becomes effective. UWMF will conduct a fair market review of fees under this Agreement using its current methodology and will share the results with DCSO. If the fair market value review supports a three percent (3%) increase in fees, such increase will become effective as of the upcoming January 1 with no further change to this Agreement. If the fair market value review does not support a three percent (3%) increase in fees, then the parties will amend this Agreement to reflect any change in fees to align with fair market value, as necessary.
- 3.3.2 Effective January 1, 2026, and alternating January 1s thereafter, UWMF will conduct a fair market review of fees under this Agreement using its current methodology and will share the results with DCSO. The parties will amend this Agreement to reflect any change in fees to align with fair market value, as necessary.
- 3.3 Medical Director will provide one hundred and fifty (150) hours of Medical Director Services annually. UWMF and the Department shall ensure that the Medical Director creates accurate, timely reports, and completes monthly time reports documenting time spent providing Medical Director Services.
- 3.4. DCSO shall not withhold on behalf of any UW Faculty Physicians any sums for income tax, unemployment insurance, Social Security or any other withholding pursuant to any law or requirement of any governmental body covering DCSO employees, nor shall DCSO make

available to UW Faculty Physicians any of the benefits afforded employees of DCSO. All such income tax, unemployment insurance, Social Security withholdings and employee benefits, if any, are the sole responsibility of Medical School and UWMF.

4. Qualifications of UW Faculty Physicians.

- **4.1.** Medical School and UWMF agree that UW Faculty Physicians who provide Services under this Agreement must, at all times during the Term of this Agreement, be in good standing and duly licensed to practice medicine in the state of Wisconsin.
- **4.2.** UW Faculty Physicians who provide Services under this Agreement shall at all times during the Term of this Agreement, maintain a valid Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) registration and shall not be excluded or suspended from participation in any federal or state health care program, including Medicare, Medicaid or CHAMPUS/Tricare.
- **4.3.** UW Faculty Physician shall perform the Services under this Agreement in a professional manner and in accordance with the requirements of any relevant federal, state, or local laws. UW Faculty Physician shall cooperate with DCSO, its staff and its employees to ensure the delivery of high quality Services under this Agreement.
- 4.4. UWMF or the University shall promptly notify DCSO in the event UW Actors have reason to believe UW Faculty Physician's medical license or DEA registration has or will be revoked, suspended or not renewed or UW Faculty Physician otherwise no longer maintains the qualifications as set forth in this Agreement. In the event that the UW Faculty Physician providing Medical Director Services under this Agreement no longer maintains the qualifications set forth herein, UWMF and Department will assign another UW Faculty Physician who meets these qualifications and who is acceptable to DCSO to provide Services under this Agreement.

5. Requirements of DCSO.

- **5.1.** DCSO shall at all times appropriately enforce policies and as necessary, implement compliance or quality assurance measures to ensure the delivery of high quality health care services.
- 5.2. DCSO shall work cooperatively with UW Faculty Physician to ensure the proper coordination and delivery of Services in a timely and professional manner. DCSO's cooperation shall include providing UW Faculty Physician reasonable access to patient health care records and business records, as necessary for the performance of Services under this Agreement. DCSO shall provide UW Faculty Physician with reasonable access to any survey results prepared by any division of the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, during the Term of this Agreement. DCSO shall provide UW Faculty Physician with reasonable access to patient health care records or business records after the termination of this Agreement, to the extent that access is needed for UW Faculty Physician to respond to a claim(s) or other request for information from a federal, state, or local governmental agency, court or tribunal. This provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

- 5.3. DCSO shall provide such space, equipment, services, supplies and qualified personnel to UW Faculty Physician as may be necessary or reasonably requested by UW Faculty Physician for the performance of Services under this Agreement. Such equipment shall be the equivalent to that provided to a tactical EMS medic and shall include a communication device, such as a radio, and identification, such as a badge (such badge shall clearly identify UW Faculty Physicians as employees of the University of Wisconsin). All such equipment must be in good working order and suitable for use. DCSO is responsible for selecting, maintaining, and managing all equipment. DCSO shall provide UW Faculty Physician with a DCSO email address to allow for secure communication of confidential information.
- **5.4.** DCSO shall implement and maintain an effective corporate compliance plan, designed to detect and ensure compliance with federal, state and local law.
- **6. Termination.** This Agreement may be terminated as follows:
- 6.1. <u>Termination upon Notice</u>. Either party may terminate this Agreement by providing at least sixty (60) calendar days prior written notice to the other party.
- 6.2. <u>Termination for Breach.</u> In the event of a material breach by one party, the non-breaching party may provide written notice of the breach and terminate this Agreement provided, however, that the breaching party shall be allowed to cure such breach within ten (10) business days of receipt of written notice of such breach. If the breaching party, prior to expiration of such time period, has cured the breach, this Agreement shall remain in effect.
- **6.3.** <u>Immediate Termination.</u> This Agreement shall terminate immediately and automatically when:
 - **6.3.1.** A receiver is appointed to take possession of all or substantially all of the assets of a party or a party makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors or a party takes any action under any insolvency, bankruptcy, or reorganization act, or a party otherwise ceases to do business; or
 - **6.3.2.** Either party is excluded from participation in any federally funded health care program, including Medicare or Medicaid, as of the effective date of such exclusion.

7. Liability Coverage, Claims and Other Notifications, Hold Harmless.

7.1. Physicians' Liability Coverage. UW Faculty Physicians are employees of the University of Wisconsin, and therefore, employees of the state of Wisconsin. In performing Services under this Agreement, all UW Faculty Physicians will be acting within the scope of their University/State of Wisconsin employment. The State of Wisconsin provides liability coverage for the acts or omission of acts of its employees committed within the scope of their employment under Section 895.46 of the Wisconsin Statutes and is self-insured. All UW Faculty Physicians are protected by this statutory liability coverage while acting within the scope of their employment.

- 7.2. <u>Claims Notification.</u> DCSO shall promptly advise UWMF and University Office of Legal Affairs, University of Wisconsin-Madison, Room 361 Bascom Hall, 500 Lincoln Drive, Madison, Wisconsin, 53706, in the event it has reason to believe a claim may exist against Medical School, any UW Faculty Physician or against any UWMF employees or agents, in connection with the Services performed under this Agreement. Notification under this Section shall be for information purposes only and shall not substitute for the statutory notification and claim procedure of Section 893.82 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- 7.3. Notification of Claims or Investigations Against DCSO. DCSO shall promptly advise UWMF and University Administrative Legal Services, University of Wisconsin-Madison, Room 361 Bascom Hall, 500 Lincoln Drive, Madison, Wisconsin, 53706, in the event it has reason to believe a claim may exist against DCSO or its staff in connection with DCSO's operations, the delivery of health care services, or DCSO has reason to believe it may be subject to an investigation by a federal, state or local governmental entity regarding the DCSO's operations, including but not limited to billing and coding, health care quality, compliance with OSHA or the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- 7.4. <u>DCSO's Liability Coverage.</u> DCSO, at its sole cost and expense, shall procure and maintain in full force and effect throughout the term of this Agreement, such policies of general liability, professional liability and other insurance as shall be necessary to insure DCSO and its employees and agents against any claim(s) for damages arising by reason of personal injuries or death occasioned directly or indirectly in connection with the performance of any service by DCSO, the use of any property and facilities or equipment provided by DCSO and the activities performed by DCSO in connection with this Agreement. Upon request of UWMF, DCSO shall deliver copies of such policies to UWMF prior to or upon execution of this Agreement, and any modifications, extensions or renewals of such policies prior to or upon each anniversary date of this Agreement. DCSO agrees to notify UWMF immediately upon notification from an insurance carrier that a policy will be canceled.
- 7.5. No Indemnification. The Parties agree that each Party is and shall be responsible for any claim or damage resulting from its own negligence, acts, or omissions. This Agreement shall not be construed to require a Party to indemnify the other Party from its negligence, acts, or omissions.

8. Miscellaneous.

- **8.1.** Relationship of Parties. None of the provisions of this Agreement are intended to create, nor shall be deemed or construed to create, any relationship between UWMF and DCSO other than that of independent entities contracting with each other solely for the purpose of effecting the provisions of this Agreement. No party shall be construed to be an agent, employee or representative of the other.
- **8.2.** Confidentiality. The UW Actors will not disclose confidential or proprietary information relating to DCSO operations (such as strategic plans, business plans, DCSO financial information, volume data, etc.,) which has been identified by DCSO in writing to UWMF as

confidential or proprietary, except as consented to or requested by DCSO or as required by law. Copies of materials in the hands of University officials or UWMF officials may be subject to the Wisconsin Public Records and Property Laws (Ch. 19.21 – 19.39 of the Wisconsin Statutes). In the event that a request for materials containing the financial terms of this Agreement or other information identified by DCSO as confidential or proprietary is made pursuant to the Public Records and Property Laws, UWMF agrees to provide notice to DCSO and to request that DCSO identify those materials or parts of materials which are exceptions to the usual rule of disclosure of records and should be kept confidential. If a difference of opinion exists between the parties over whether an exception to inspection and disclosure of such material applies to the request, DCSO will have the option to litigate the issue.

8.3. Notices. Any notice required or permitted by this Agreement must be in writing and be delivered personally or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested and postage prepaid, to the following at the addresses indicated:

Any entity may change the person to receive notice or its address by written notice to the other entities.

- 8.4. <u>Violation of Law or Regulation</u>. In the event this Agreement or any part of it is deemed by any agency of the Federal or State government to be in violation of any law, regulation, or decision, then at the option of either party, such provision shall be deemed void and of no effect. In that event, the parties will negotiate in good faith an alternate provision which as nearly as possible, without violating the law, regulation or decision, accomplish the purpose and intent of this Agreement.
- **8.5.** Assignment. No party may assign any of its rights, duties or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other parties.

- **8.6.** Governing Law and Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted under the laws of the state of Wisconsin. Venue of any action initiated by any party shall be in Dane County, Wisconsin.
- **8.7.** Waiver. Waiver by a party of breach or noncompliance with any terms or conditions of this Agreement can be accomplished only by a specific written agreement and shall not operate as or be construed to be a waiver of any subsequent breach or noncompliance.
- 8.8. Employment Non-Discrimination. DCSO represents that it shall not discriminate against its employees on any grounds which are prohibited by federal or state equal employment opportunity statutes, rules or executive orders, including but not limited to, age, sex, race, sexual orientation, religion, national origin or disability. Medical School and UWMF warrant that they will not discriminate against their employees on any grounds which are prohibited by federal or state equal employment opportunity statutes, rules or executive orders, including but not limited to, age, sex, race, sexual orientation, religion, national origin or disability.
- **8.9.** Headings. The headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of any provision herein.
- **8.10.** Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous agreement, whether oral or written, of the parties, including but not limited to the Medical Director Services Agreement between the parties dated January 1, 2019. All Exhibits and Recitals are incorporated into and constitute an integral part of this Agreement as if fully set forth in this Agreement.
- **8.11.** Severability. If any provision or any part of any provision of this Agreement shall be determined to be void, illegal, invalid or unenforceable, this determination shall not affect the remainder of this Agreement, which shall continue in full force and effect in accordance with its remaining terms.
- **8.12.** Amendment. The parties may amend this Agreement only in a writing signed by the parties, specifically identified as an amendment to this Agreement.
- **8.13.** Marketing. DCSO agrees to obtain, in advance, written approval from UWMF for any and all advertising and other promotional materials, in any medium, which refer to any UW Actor.
- **8.14.** No Referrals. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as requiring or inducing any party or, as applicable, any of its owners, directors, members, officers, employees, affiliates, contractors or agents to refer any patients or business, reimbursable in whole or in part under any federal or state health care program, to the other party. UW Faculty Physician shall be entitled to refer patients to any hospital or other healthcare DCSO or provider deemed by the physician best qualified to deliver medical services to any particular patient.

- 8.15. Privacy / HIPAA Compliance. The parties acknowledge all state and federal statutes and regulations regarding the privacy and security of patients' health information, including but not limited to all such regulations under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996. The parties agree to protect the privacy and security of all patient health information in accordance with and as established by all such statutes and regulations. To the extent UWMF is a business associate of DCSO, the parties will abide by the Business Associate Agreement entered into between the parties.
- **8.16.** Compliance with Other Laws. DCSO shall obtain and maintain all permits, licenses and other certificates necessary to lawfully satisfy its duties under this Agreement. DCSO shall ensure that the personnel employed by or affiliated with DCSO who assist UW Faculty Physicians or otherwise perform under this Agreement are qualified to perform such services and possess all permits, licenses, and certifications required by all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, or regulations.
- **8.17.** Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed electronically and in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

- (a) Provide medical director oversight, including protocol development and revisions of Dane County Tactical Emergency Medical Services (TEMS) Protocols
- (b) Provide and oversee ongoing training for TEMS providers, including evaluation and maintenance of clinical competencies and medical procedures;
- (c) Provide ongoing basic medical training for tactical operators, including but not limited to, tourniquet application, basic wound care, and casualty immobilization and extrication;
- (d) Provide on-scene medical oversight and support for Tactical Response Team operations, including trainings and field operations;
- (e) Provide basic retraining of field Law Enforcement Officers, including but not limited to Individual First Aid Kit (IFAK) content and use, basic first aid/medical stabilization, and management of opiate overdoses/Narcan administration.
