Subject: Request for comments on Maier rezone out of wetland petition

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Brian and Al,

As you're aware Pat Maier has applied for a rezone out of inland-wetland in an attempt to resolve the violation of tiling the wetland and pumping the drain water to the east side of Schumacher Rd. The application materials submitted can be viewed here.

Chapter 11 of the Dane County Code of Ordinances provides the following criteria to be considered for such rezone petitions:

A wetland, or a portion thereof, in the shoreland-wetland or inland-wetland district shall not be rezoned if the proposed rezoning may result in a significant adverse impact upon any of the following:

- (a) Storm and flood water storage capacity;
- (b) Maintenance of dry season stream flow, the discharge of groundwater to a wetland, the recharge of groundwater from a wetland to another area, or the flow of groundwater through a wetland;
- (c) Filtering or storage of sediments, nutrients, heavy metals or organic compounds that would otherwise drain into navigable waters;
 - (d) Shoreline protection against soil erosion;
 - (e) Fish spawning, breeding, nursery or feeding grounds;
 - (f) Wildlife habitat; or
 - (g) Areas of special recreational, scenic or scientific interest, including scarce wetland types.

In advance of the June 18th public hearing on the petition we are seeking any comments from DNR regarding any potential significant adverse impacts if the wetland zoning protections are removed from the property. Any comments we receive will be incorporated into our staff report and used to make a recommendation to the Zoning and Land Regulation Committee. Please submit any comments by June 13th.
