9.a 2014 Operations Division RPT-102

- -Parens met with all department managers and operations staff to assess how things are going in the Operations Division.
- -Several themes emerged; that operations needs to clarify their role, express ownership, be centralized around things that effect the entire department and provide strong customer service.
- -The department currently has seven open positions.
 - **9.b** 2014 Community Health Division RPT-104
- -A staffing assessment was done and we are where we need to be with a cushion.
- -We are part of more funding for our Nurse Family Partnership program in Adams County for expansion.
 - **9.c** 2014 Environmental Health Division RPT-103
- -The division had a summer AHEC student to help us align our food program with the national voluntary regulatory food program standards. We meet nine of them so there is still work to do.
- -End of year inspections were completed.
- -The 2% increase in fees on food establishments go into effect next year.
- -There was an outbreak in Dane and Rock counties of Norovirus in pre-packaged foods which will mean new methods are being developed.
- -There was a mobile home park septic system failure, 50 units were affected.
- -Another dangerous animal redetermination was issued and has not been appealed.
- -A study with the University show higher nitrate levels in aquifers.
- -Madison Kipp Corporation is starting to treat contaminated groundwater.
- -Ebola is still of some concern as travelers return from stricken countries.
