3	ACCEPTING DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES GRANT FUNDS
4	
5	The Medical Examiner's Office has applied for and received approval for grant funding from the
6	Department of Health Services with the State of Wisconsin.
7	
8	Funding for this grant will support the Medical Examiner's Office Cadaver Dog Program for
9	Fatality Management and includes one-time funding to support the start-up of a Wisconsin
10	cadaver dog program housed in the Dane County Medical Examiner's Office. The grant is for
11	\$22,500 and includes equipment (\$8,500) and the costs of personnel assisting with the mass
12	fatality training related expenses for mass fatality strike teams (\$14,000). The personnel costs
13	are included in the 2015 budget. This resource will be a state asset to be available throughout
14	the state in the event of a mass casualty incident. Dane County and the State of Wisconsin's
15	Fatality Management capability will be significantly strengthened with a cadaver dog program to
16	ensure proper and timely recovery of human remains and personal effects.
17	
18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that \$8,500 be set up as additional revenue in a newly
19 20	created Medical Examiner revenue account named Cadaver Canine/WHEPP Revenue and be
20	credited to the general fund. Account number to be issued by the Controller's Division upon
21 22	passage of this resolution.
22 23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$8,500 be transferred from the general fund to a newly
24	created Medical Examiner expenditure account named Cadaver Canine/WHEPP. Account
25	number to be issued by the Controller's Division upon passage of this resolution.
26	
27	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$13,005 be transferred from the general fund to MEDEXAM
28	10072, Limited Term Employees; and \$995 be transferred from the general fund to MEDEXAM
29	10108, Social Security to cover supplemental personnel costs related to training.
30	
31	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that all unexpended funds and unrecognized revenues from these
32	accounts be carried forward from the 2015 to the 2016 budget period.
