AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE DANE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES,
REGARDING THE NAME AND MEMBERSHIP
OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Dane does ordain as follows:

ARTICLE 1. Unless otherwise expressly stated herein, all references to section and chapter numbers are to those of the Dane County Code of Ordinances.

ARTICLE 2. Section 15.46(1) is amended to read as follows:

15.46 ~~CRIMINAL~~ COMMUNITY JUSTICE COUNCIL.

(1) Composition.

(a) The ~~Criminal~~ Community Justice Council shall consist of ~~six~~ eleven voting members:

1. the county executive;
2. the county board chair;
3. the sheriff;
4. the district attorney;
5. the presiding judge of the circuit court;
6. the clerk of courts;
7. three persons from diverse backgrounds who have lived experiences of incarceration or have been directly impacted by the criminal justice system, and are selected from a list of recommendations submitted by relevant community organizations including but not limited to Nehemiah, JustDane, MOSES, EXPO, FREE, Focused Interpretation, and Centro Hispano to the Public Protection and Judiciary Committee and Health and Human Needs Committee at a joint meeting;
8. two persons with behavioral health expertise selected from a list of recommendations submitted by relevant community organizations including but not limited to Recovery Coalition, NAMI, Homeless Services Consortium and Chrysalis to the Public Protection and Judiciary Committee and Health and Human Needs Committee at a joint meeting.

(b) ~~There shall be six~~ The following are non-voting members of the ~~Criminal~~ Community Justice Council:

1. a representative of the state public defender's office;
2. the City of Madison chief of police;
3. a police chief from a jurisdiction outside the City of Madison appointed by the Dane County Police Chief's Association;
4. a representative of the Wisconsin Department of Corrections;
5. a representative of Dane County municipal judges;
6. a representative of the Public Protection and Judiciary Committee, appointed by the committee chair.

46 (c) Non-voting members will not be counted for purposes of establishing a
47 quorum.

48 (d) The Community Justice Council shall permit any member of the county
49 board of supervisors to take part in its deliberations and to speak on any agenda
50 item. This includes closed sessions except if the individual supervisor's exclusion
51 is necessary for the purpose of the closed session. Nevertheless, county board of
52 supervisors who are not members of the Community Justice Council shall not vote,
53 shall not be counted in determining whether or not there is a quorum, and may not
54 make or second any motion.
